

What a year this 1976! Our nation's 200th birthday and the 75th anniversary of the outpouring of the Baptism of the Holy Spirit upon the students of "Bethel Bible College" in Topeka, Kansas—right in the heart of our nation—on New Year's Day 1901.

Our country was established for Life, Liberty and the Pursuit of Happiness. Yet some how with all our human ability and, ingenuity and the wonderful advancements made in this 200 years by man, that Liberty has somehow eluded us. The majority seem to think that Liberty means everyone doing "his own thing" with no thought of the effect it may have on the other fellow. We live in a world of beckoning voices and polluted sounds, where we are confused by conflicting authorities on marriage, child-rearing and finances; easy promises, empty guaranties, and instant every thing. We haven't the time to wait, we think, for anything, we need it now!-or even better yet "yesterday". But we have forgotten the source of true Liberty. The Bible says, (II Cor. 3:17) "where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty." The individual Christian gets "loose" only when he is controlled by the Spirit of the Lord. We need to yield to Him daily, hourly and moment by moment. I Thess. 5:19 says, "Quench not the Spirit" We are not to use Him but allow Him to use us. I quote the following from the book "Day by Day." A daily devotional.

"A black friend used to say to me, "Don't 'squench' the Spirit." He coined his own word, 'squench' being a combination of "Squelch and quench", it really should be in the dictionary. We quench the Spirit in more ways than we

How we do conspire to limit God in our meetings! We have an Honored Guest in every Christian gathering and He can be grieved very easily. A frivolous spirit, a critical or rebellious frame of mind, a (fed-up) complacency—that will do it. The very way we arrange physical details, the way we scatter all over the church, two to a pew; the way we hear and hear not—surely "squench" says it, for we squelch and quench the Spirit."

Christian America let's awake and lead the way back to the goals our land was founded on. Back to Life, Liberty and the Pursuit of Happiness! Back to the Lord and the Holy Spirit—for "where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is LIBERTY!! HAPPY BIRTHDAY USA!!




Rev. and Mrs. Lyndel Arnall and Lynette

Paula Faye Buschman







Proclaim Liberty Throughout All The Land

This year as we celebrate our nation's two-hundredth birthday, one word stands out. That word is LIBERTY. The word is referred to by many different people in many different ways.

On the 13c stamp there is a picture of the Liberty Bell. Also on the stamp are the words which are cast upon the bell; "Proclaim liberty throughout all the land unto the inhabitants thereof." These words are from Leviticus 25:10, and express what should be the desire of every Christian.

"Jesus spoke on Freedom"

What did Jesus have to say about being truly free? Let's look to the Gospel of John (8:34-36). "Jesus answered them, Verily, verily I say unto you, Whosoever committeth sin is the servant of sin. And the servant abideth not in the house forever; but the Son abideth ever. If the Son therefore shall make you free, ye shall be free indeed."

Christ speaks very plainly here. If a person commits sin they are in bondage to sin and are not free. We cannot sin and be free from sin at the same time. But if the Son, Jesus Christ, will set us free, we are truly free. Christ has paid the price that we might be free from sin, and any thing else that binds our life.

We are told that Christ has conquered those things which bind us. (Ephesians 4:7-8) "But unto every one of us is given grace according to the measure of the gift of Christ. Wherefore he saith, When he ascended upon high, he led captivity captive, and gave gifts unto men."

When Jesus went back to be with his Father, he had control over the forces that bind and captivate our lives. These forces include sin, sickness, and death. These are at the Son's command, and he will let us free if we will turn completely to Him.

"Commit it to Christ"

Many of us have come into the Kingdom of God and experienced the wondrous fellowship with God's Son, Jesus Christ. But we find we are not as victorious as we would like to be and that many times sin has its way in our lives. What are we to do?

Let's look to what Paul had to say. (II Timothy 1:12b). "For I know whom I have believed, and am persuaded that he is able to keep that which I have committed unto him against that day."

We know whom we have believed, as Paul did, that is in Jesus Christ. And we believe that He is able to keep us. So what is the difference?

God has made us where we have a free choice in what happens in our lives. When we come to salvation we are

called, but we make the choice of which way to go. If we make the choice to believe in Christ and repent, we are saved. But even after we are saved, Christ does not force us to go further.

We have a free choice in what we allow God to take care of. Paul said, "he is able to keep that which I've committed unto him." If we commit our bodies to Christ we can expect healing and health from Him. When we commit our finances to Him we can expect our needs to be met, and if we commit our children and the way we bring them up to Him, He will take care of them.

God is not responsible for anything in our lives that we have not given to Him, but that which is His to take care of He guards lovingly.

When we have set ourselves apart for the single purpose of serving Christ, He will work a work in our lives to set us apart from the world. This work is Sanctification. The beautiful work and word means: Purify, separate from the world, made holy. This was what Christ was praying for in John the 17th chapter.

This wondrous experience can be ours if we will completely commit ourselves to Christ. When we experience being sanctified, we can understand such things as life "more abundantly" (John 10:10), understanding being one with Christ and fellow Christians (John 17). Only then will we understand being "free indeed." (John 8:36) Let us each truly commit everything to Christ and His Service.

"Stand in Liberty"

Galatians 6:1 says: "Stand therefore in the liberty where with Christ hath made us free, and be not entangled again with the yoke of bondage."

As we have laid aside all sin, sickness, and whatever may hinder in our work for the Lord, let us not pick them up and bind ourselves again, let us stand assured that they are in Christ's Hands and we are free. If we desire to stay free we cannot entangle ourselves in the corruption, unholiness, and worries of this world.

We must stay upon God and His Work. Christ stated this very clearly. (John 8:31,32) "If ye continue in my word, then are ye my disciples indeed; And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free."

It took believing God's Word to free us from sin, and we must have a strong foundation of God's Word to continue to stand in this liberty.

"Proclaim Liberty"

We that belong to Christ can truly "proclaim liberty" to everyone in our land by making known the Gospel of our

Greetings!

I have been accepted as an assistant leader for a Teen Missions Team to Brazil in South America. The team is made up of 25 teens plus leaders and will be building an airstrip in the vast Amazon basin for use by J.A.A.R.S. (Jungle Aviation and Radio Service), the air branch of Wycliffe Bible Translators. The airstrip will be done solely with the aid of picks and shovels. Our work schedule calls for five and a half days work, with Saturday afternoons free. Sundays we will have opportunities to share our love for God with the tribal people.

The team will meet on July 12 in Florida for two weeks of Boot Camp training for summer involvement. The team will fly to Manaus, accessible only by river or air, in the heart of the Amazon basin. After seeing the sights in Manaus, we will travel by river launch three to four days and nights down the Amazon and up the Madeira River, a tributary of the Amazon River, to the Puerto Velho area. After six weeks on the field, we will return by the same route to Florida for a reunion with other 1976 Teen Missions Teams. I will then return home to share my summer missionary involvement with my friends. It will be a big, but exciting responsibility to help lead and counsel these young people and share in their spiritual growth as they realize how desperately the world needs to hear the Gospel.
