

April 2021 Meeting Report

Our first meeting for 2021 was held outdoors at ReVive Automotive Aesthetics in Byron Center. The weather was warm and sunny, and about 28 members were in attendance.

The meeting started off with Kaan Aya, owner of ReVive, showing us how he cleans and details his customer's cars. He showed us the benefits of using a two-bucket system of washing the paint and the wheels. That's two buckets for the wheels, and two buckets for the paint. One bucket for soapy water, the other for rinse water. The wheels and tires are the dirtiest part of a car, so he washes them first (with dish soap). He then attacks the paint (with pH neutral shampoo), one panel at a time. If needed, he uses a clay bar on the paint to remove debris that the soap and water couldn't remove. Kaan recommends dying the car with a leaf blower, and/or a twisted loop microfiber towel.

When it comes to protecting the paint, he recommends a ceramic coating instead of normal waxes. Ceramic has smaller molecules compared to paint, so they imbed in the paint and protect longer. Wax molecules are about the same size as the paint molecules, so it lies on top of the paint and can be washed or worn off quickly.

President Scott VanTamelen passed around Brian Martinie's Treasurer's Report for March. We had income from membership dues. Expenditures included newsletter postage and a donation to the Gilmore Garage Works.

The next meeting is May 4th, and will be held at Ron and Elaine VanZytveld's "cave". Please arrive by 6:00 PM. The ladies are planning on preparing tacos and salads.

There has been a destination change for our Spring Dust Off Cruise. I drove the planned route to our original destination, the RE Olds Museum in downtown Lansing. What I found was disappointing. Grand River Avenue is completely torn up and is extremely dirty and bumpy. Plus, the intended restaurant, the Olympic Broil, is cut off, due to the construction. After sharing these findings with Scott, it was decided to come up with a plan B, which is outlined elsewhere in this newsletter.
