#### RESPECT FOR LIFE MONTH: END OF LIFE ISSUES

Few people like to think of themselves incapacitated at the end of their lives and so they don't really prepare for it. Yet some preparation can reduce the shock and stress that captures the loved ones of an incapacitated person near death. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops adds: "We can safeguard our Catholic values by appointing a responsible and trustworthy person now to make decisions for us, in the event that we are incapable of doing so, either physically or mentally. It is important to be aware of the different legal or medical documents that are available or are often used to define a patient's care (www.respectlife.org/advancedirectives)."

Fortunately, the Diocese of Salt Lake City has a document that appoints a responsible person to make end of life decisions. The same document also helps to define moral points critical to a patient's care. Four general points are offered at the beginning of this document:

- **1.** Human life is a precious gift from God. This truth should inform all health care decisions. Every person has a moral obligation to preserve his or her life and to use it for God's glory.
- **2.** We have the right to direct our own care and the responsibility to act according to the principles of Catholic moral teaching. Each person has a right to clear and accurate information about a proposed course of treatment and its consequences, so that the person can make an informed decision about whether to receive the proposed treatment.
- **3**. Suicide, euthanasia, and acts that intentionally and directly cause death by deed or omission are never morally acceptable.

**4**. Death is a beginning, not an end. Death, being conquered by Christ, need not be resisted by any and every means and a person may refuse medical treatment that is extraordinary/disproportionate.

A treatment is extraordinary/disproportionate when it offers little or no hope of benefit and cannot be provided without undue burden, expense, or pain. To access the full document, visit the diocesan website www.dioslc.org. On the home page there is a small magnifying glass next on the top right side of the page. Click on the magnifying glass and then in the small box labeled, "search" type in "advance care directives" and press the return key of your computer. On the next page, click "a guide to health care directives" and then the full document will appear.
