<u>Costs per dog per run</u>: For all dogs in the same household, entries received and paid for in the same transaction. Runs added after closing date will be \$12.00; no package rates will apply. Junior Handler runs - \$5/run no matter how many.

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WHAT IS BETA FORMAT?

The beta format can be used at trials that have most of the classes running 2 rounds in the same day.

Beta format allows you to run the same course twice in the same course order (no renumbering of the obstacles, no changing the course). And yes, you can qualify twice, too!

This means that everyone walks the course, then everyone runs the course. There is no 2nd walk-thru before round 2 begins.

If you choose to only enter in 1 round of a class, that is okay. You will still need to walk the course during course walk-thru with everyone else (there will not be a separate walk-thru for exhibitors only running in round 2).

Q: What about Regular 1 & 2 – will the courses still be reversed like they normally are?

A: No, when using the Beta format all courses where multiple rounds are run will be the same course (no renumbering, no reversing of the course). Regular 1 & 2 will be the same course without any renumbering.

Q: What about Bonus Lines for Elite Classes?

A: If there is a Bonus Line on a course, it will only be available for the first round.

Q: Why is Chaotic Canines trying out the Beta format at this trial?

A: Many clubs in other areas have tried out the Beta format at their trials and the exhibitors have loved it! There are several reasons that we are excited to offer Beta format to our exhibitors:

- The chance to try a different handling technique if the handling on the first round wasn't quite "right" or if you want to try 2 different handling techniques on the course
- Less course building and teardown (saving our bodies and time!)

The trial will be held indoors. Ring size is 85' wide by 110" long with a dirt surface. All obstacles used are according to NADAC rules, including rubber matted contacts. Electronic timing will be used.

Final trial information and judging schedule will be sent with final confirmation and be available on the CCC web site at <u>http://www.chaotick9s.com</u> 3-4 days after the trial closes.

Levels, Categories & Divisions:

Levels are Intro, Novice, Open and Elite and a dog may be in different levels throughout the trial. *Categories* are Proficient and Skilled and the dog must run in one category *only* for the duration of the trial. All dogs running under Skilled, Veteran, or Veteran/Junior Handler **MUST** jump 4" lower than their Proficient height.

Divisions are Standard, Veteran Dog, Veteran Handler or Junior Handler; a dog may not be entered in more than one division of the same class at a trial but may be in different division in different classes - i.e. Veteran Handler Regular, Standard Handler Jumpers. Visit <u>www.NADACforum.com</u> (look under Media) for further details. Proficient now allows 5 point Qs.

As of January 2014: Dogs must enter the Veterans Division in all jumping classes after their 9th birthday. After their 12th birthday, dogs must enter the Skilled Category, Veterans Division for jumping classes and Skilled Category for non-jumping classes.

"Intro" is a level for the classes, just like Novice, Open and Elite. The <u>only</u> Intro level class with weaves will be Intro Weavers and it will have one set of 6 poles. The Intro level will have no tunnel/contact discriminations. The Intro level is a full titling level with the basic titles at 30 points, Outstanding Performance at 60 points and Superior Performance at 100 points for Chances, Jumpers, Tunnelers, Weavers, Hoopers, Touch N Go, Extreme Chances, Extreme Barrelers, Extreme Gaters, and Extreme Hoopers. For Regular, the basic title is at 30 points, Outstanding Performance is at 100 points and Superior Performance is at 200 points. Note that the Intro level is entirely optional. There is no requirement that a dog must start at the intro level. Dogs must be 18 months old and all other NADAC rules apply to entries.

Entry Information

IMPORTANT. Please check your dog's NADAC registration number on your trial confirmation as soon as you receive it; also, please check the copy of the results posted at the trial. You should report any errors to the Trial Secretary immediately.

NADAC records trial results as they are submitted by the Chuckanut Chaotic Canines. The individual trial results submitted by CCC are uploaded to the <u>www.NADACForum.com</u> within two weeks after the NADAC office receives them from the club. Please accept the responsibility to review those results, and check that your registration number and qualifying points, as reported by the CCC, are correct. You can join the Forum by going to <u>www.NADACForum.com</u> and submitting your request. If you find an error in the reporting of your dog's qualifying points or registration number, please contact the Trial Secretary for Chuckanut Chaotic Canines. CCC is responsible for correcting any errors and informing NADAC.

<u>Levels</u>: Points earned at a higher level of a class, prior to the completion of the lower level title, will not be recorded by NADAC for future use. If a dog earns points in a level of a class that they are not eligible to title in, those points will not be added to the dog's records.

Entry Rules: We will accept entries, **postmarked** on Monday, March 23rd, 2015 or later until the limit or the Closing Date is reached. Should the trial fill before the closing date, a waiting list will be started based on **postmark date** for entries. **No hand-delivered entries will be accepted within the first 48 hours** of trial opening. CCC has the right to refuse any entry. Anyone who is not currently in good standing with NADAC will not be allowed entry into the trial.

Day of show (DoS) entries may be taken if space is available. Entries for dogs not already entered in the trial must be submitted by 5:00 p.m. on Friday and 8:00 a.m. on Saturday and Sunday. Price of DoS entries will be \$12 per added run for all runs. Package prices do not apply. Entries must be received by the trial secretary no later than 30 minutes before the trial starts for the day (except for EGC runs which must be received BEFORE courses are built).

Confirmations: These will be sent via email. Be sure to include your CURRENT *legible* email address on the registration form. If you do not have email, your confirmation will be sent via USPS mail. **If you have not received a confirmation by May 5, 2015, contact Trial Secretary, Marian Snapp, ASAP.**

Dogs entered in the Intro class may jump at any height requested by the owner regardless of dog's actual height.

Non-Jumping Classes-Veteran or Disabled Handler. Handlers who are 60 years or older, or who have a disability that restricts mobility, may choose to enter the non-jumping classes as a Veteran Handler and receive 10% more standard course time. This option is for Veteran/Disabled handlers in the **non-jumping classes only** and is designed for handlers who, due to age or impairment, are mobility limited and need extra time to guide their canine partners through an agility course.

When entering as a Veteran/Disabled Handler, you must enter **all** dogs in **all** classes for the entire trial in this Division and the dog **must jump 4" lower** than your Proficient, Standard Division jump height. In the non-jumping classes, dogs will be scored and placed with their Standard Division jump height.

- **Refunds:** Requests for withdrawals prior to the closing date will receive a full refund. Handlers with medical emergencies providing a doctor's note or having an injured dog or bitch in heat, with veterinarian's documentation & excusal, may cancel 24 hours prior to the start of the weekend and receive a refund less \$10/day. No refunds will be issued for less than \$10.00. There will be no refunds for entries withdrawn after the closing date (other than just stated) or in the event a dog and/or handler are dismissed from competition, regardless of the reason for such dismissal, including, but not limited to, aggressive dogs.
- **Move-ups:** Move-ups for Friday or Saturday of the trial must be submitted to the trial secretary in writing (e-mail acceptable) no later than Monday, May 4th at 6 p.m. **DAY-TO-DAY MOVE-UPS WILL BE ALLOWED AT THIS TRIAL**.

Trial Days

Check-In: Check-in will be available 4:30 to 5:15 p.m. on Friday evening and 7:30 to 8:15 a.m. Saturday & Sunday.

Crating: There is plenty of space in the building for crating. This is a covered and enclosed area. NO set-up is allowed before 3 p.m. on Friday afternoon.

Start Times: First dog on the line at 5:30 p.m. on Friday, and 8:30 a.m. on Saturday and Sunday.

Judge's briefing begins 15 minutes before competition starts for the day. Friday - 5:15 p.m., Saturday and Sunday – 8:15 a.m. Measuring will occur before the briefing.

- Availability of Food: Restaurants and fast food outlets are about 15 minute away. Breakfast munchies will be available by donation and lunch is available free to volunteers and "by donation" to non-volunteers, after the volunteers have eaten. There will be lots of opportunity for you to volunteer since we are running only one ring at a time. ^(C) Otherwise you will need to bring your own food.
- Warm-up area: A warm-up area consisting of a jump, hoop and set of weaves will be available to all exhibitors. Obstacles may not be taken in sequence.
- **Running Order:** Before each class, a running order will be posted at the gate. When compiling the running order, we do our best to separate handlers running multiple dogs. Since this is a one ring trial, there will be no ring conflicts. Our goal is to keep running order changes to a minimum.
- **CONTAINERIZED TRIAL All food and** toys must be contained at the trial and none can be left lying about loose. This includes crating areas. Food or a small noiseless toy may be carried into the ring in your pocket provided it is contained in a zip-lock bag or small container such as a pill bottle. The container cannot be visible in the ring nor within 10 feet of the ring. Do not indicate to your dog that you have this item on you. Remove the container only when you are at least 10 feet outside the ring. This policy has been implemented to reduce the possibility of dogs fighting over loose food or toys, diminish dogs dragging their handlers back to their reward, and lessen the amount of insects around loose food.

Awards: Ribbons will be awarded for first through fourth place in all jump heights of all divisions with the exception of Chances which is pass/fail with no placement ribbons being awarded. Qualifying ribbons will be awarded for qualifying runs. IF you are close to achieving the NATCH for your dog, please let the trial secretary know so that arrangements can be made for ribbons and other suitable celebrations.

Measuring: Dogs to be measured;

All dogs in the Proficient Category, Novice, Open or Elite, jumping 4", 8", 12" or 16" (without permanent height card)

Dogs that do NOT need to be measured:

Dogs jumping 16" in the Veteran or Junior Handler Division Dogs jumping 20" and 20+ Dogs in the Skilled Category Dogs listed on the Height Exemption list

An Application for a Permanent Height Card can be downloaded from the NADAC site by going to this URL: http://www.nadac.com/forms/Application-for-Permanent-Height-Card.htm. Have the judge sign it when you get your dog measured and then send it in when you have all the signatures needed.

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NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

- This trial is sanctioned by the North American Dog Agility Council, LLC. (NADAC, LLC.) with Chuckanut Chaotic Canines (CCC) as the host club. Exhibitors, through a submission of an entry, acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of NADAC rules and regulations and agree to abide by all rules in effect at the time of this trial.
- All dogs must have a NADAC registration number. This is easily obtained from www.nadac.com.
- Bitches in heat, lame or blind dogs are ineligible for entry, as is any dog with a deformity which may cause a judge to not be able to reasonably assess the dog's ability to function and perform agility obstacles safely, and in a manner that is in the best interest, health and welfare of the dog.
- Any dog demonstrating aggression towards any person or any dog, whether inside or outside of the ring, must be excused from the agility trial. Any dog which the judge feels is not in enough control to perform all obstacles in a safe manner will be excused from the agility trial.

- No collars, leads, VISIBLE food & toys, clickers, or other aids or devices shall be permitted on the course or within 10 feet of the course entrance at any time. The only exception is leading your dog to the start on lead, and then handing the lead to a steward.
- Current Jump Height Tables, Breed Exemption List, description of classes, levels, divisions, and categories are included in the current Exhibitors Handbook.
- Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is disqualified, excused or barred from competition by action of the Trial Committee.
- Confirmation of entry and schedule of judging time will be sent via e-mail or, unless otherwise requested, to the address
 on the official entry form, after the closing date and ONCE MONEY IS RECEIVED! If an exhibitor has not received a
 confirmation at least four days prior to the show, contact the Trial Secretary, Marian Snapp (agilgolden@comcast.net or
 (360) 305-0593. Judging Schedule and other information will be available on the web site at http://www.ChaoticK9s.com.
- Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry fee. There will be a \$25 fee for any returned checks.
- Chuckanut Chaotic Canines, Marian Snapp, and/or NADAC are not responsible for the loss or damage to any dog or possession of any exhibitor whether the result was by accident or any other cause.
- It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the Trial Committee, be asked to leave the show site and no refund of any fees paid will be made.
- No entry will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, an act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of CCC.
- The Trial Committee may refuse any entry on any basis expressly provided through NADAC rules and regulations or guidelines established by NADAC. Anyone not in good standing with NADAC will not be allowed at this trial.
- It is a requirement of the club and the facility that dogs must be on leash at all times except in designated off leash areas. Owners must clean up after their dogs or they may be barred from further trials.
- Use of illegal drugs and/or alcohol on trial grounds is strictly forbidden.
- Crating is allowed in the arena in designated areas only. Some seating is available for viewing of ring activities . We ask that you not set up in the crating area before 3 p.m. on Friday. Please respect the reserved signs.
