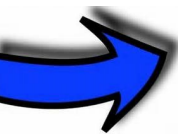

**Adoration
§2096-2097**

2096 Adoration is the first act of the virtue of religion. To adore God is to acknowledge him as God, as the Creator and Savior, the Lord and Master of everything that exists, as infinite and merciful Love. "You shall worship the Lord your God, and him only shall you serve," says Jesus, citing *Deuteronomy*.

2097 To adore God is to acknowledge, in respect and absolute submission, the "nothingness of the creature" who would not exist but for God. To adore God is to praise and exalt him and to humble oneself, as Mary did in the Magnificat, confessing with gratitude that he has done great things and holy is his name. The worship of the one God sets man free from turning in on himself, from the slavery of sin and the idolatry of the world.

**La adoración
§2096-2097**

2096 La adoración es el primer acto de la virtud de la religión. Adorar a Dios es reconocerle como Dios, como Creador y Salvador, Señor y Dueño de todo lo que existe, como Amor infinito y misericordioso. "Adorarás al Señor tu Dios y sólo a él darás culto" (Lc 4, 8), dice Jesús citando el Deuteronomio (6, 13).

2097 Adorar a Dios es reconocer, con respeto y sumisión absolutos, la "nada de la criatura", que sólo existe por Dios. Adorar a Dios es alabarlo, exaltarle y humillarse a sí mismo, como hace María en el Magnificat, confesando con gratitud que Él ha hecho grandes cosas y que su nombre es santo (cf Lc 1, 46-49). La adoración del Dios único libera al hombre del repliegue sobre sí mismo, de la esclavitud del pecado y de la idolatría del mundo.

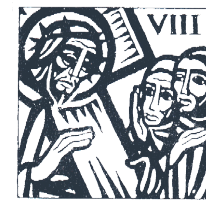
