OPEN BIDS FOR GENERATOR

We have two bids, one for Clifford Power Systems Sealed Generator Bid. Mayor opens bid. Mayor reads bid. Very technical bid price is \$48,478 (Not including installation)

Norton Power Systems Generator Includes automatic transfer switch and diesel generator. Icenhower thought they requested propane. Mayor says a couple of proposals. 16-22 weeks delivery installation included \$51,820.00

Norton Power Systems included two copies of their bid. Both bids are for diesel. Icenhower says that they were told propane. Roe said that they will have to review. Danderson says that he would like for Roe and Icenhower to review the bids and bring them back to the board with a decision.

UPDATE ON TAP SIDEWALK PROJECT (Roe)

Roe has a signed contract from Icenhower and Teal's will have it tomorrow. Tristian Beyer is holding off until he sees what happens with the lot next to Premier that he owns and he is passing that information onto the board. We may have to look at some alternative solutions and Engineer is working on it.

PARK BOARD

Jerra says that a lot of changes happening with the park board and sometimes difficult but moving in the right direction. Baseball is underway. Opened positions and gave Craig a raise. Hasn't had one since 2009. Hiring Craig a helper, a sports director to handle all sports and park director to apply for grants and make a plan to improve the parks. Has credit card changes because they terminated Krystal would like Jerra and Brittany to get a credit card. Have 6 applications for the positions. Might need a check to purchase concessions. Krystal cut up the credit card. Baseball starts Tuesday. Approved a budget. Update on the positions with the Park Board; Regina Cooke, Secretary, Brittany Counterman, Treasurer, Cindy Long Co-Chair and Jerra Icenhower, Chair. Danderson says that if the park needs anything to get over the hump that no one here has a problem with getting them whatever they need. Leon and Roe had a nice conversation with Regina during the spring cleanup. Very happy to hear some of the changes being made. Soccer is something that they will talk about. Didn't feel it was in the tax payers best interest to pay an extra \$15,000 plus the \$32,000 they were paying the director to delegate those jobs. Florez's were offered to do soccer job but for no pay and they declined.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

Sgt. Bridges is resigning and will be director until the end of June. Has touched base with someone to replace her. Mayor asks about the tornado that was close to Fair Grove. Bridges says it was straight line winds. Barn blown over and car blown into guard rail.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

Chief Enderle states that Officer Witt has been released and is back to full duty. Thanks everyone for their support. Apologizes for ruffling feathers. Thanks everyone very much for the time he has been here. Mayor says he is sure he deserved to have his feathers ruffled.

Mayor says that SMCOG is having their meeting in the morning and he is alternate if City Clerk can't attend. He will be attending the meeting tomorrow.

Mayors Report-May 23, 2023

The Mayor represented Fair Grove May 22nd in preparation for Greene County to advise the regional Transportation Advisory Committee for prioritizing local and regional needs. The prioritized needs are forwarded to MoDOT's Southwest District to be combined with other needs from MoDOT's Planning Partners to be implemented as funding becomes available.

Greene County, Priority # 2

Safety and Capacity Improvements on Route 125. Includes a center turn lane in Fair Grove to relieve congestion. School and commercial traffic is bottlenecked. Sidewalk improvements are also needed for students/pedestrians.

Greene County, Priority #3

Bridge replacement on Rte. CC east of Rte. H. Replacement of three low-water bridges that frequently flood. At the suggestion of MoDOT prioritizing the bridges may improve the replacement if additional funding is realized. Mayor suggested the low water crossing at the west limits of Fair Grove be the number one priority as flooding results in a five-mile detour that disrupts commercial and emergency services response time. The middle crossing update would be useless if the Fair Grove eastern leg was impassible following a precipitation event. Rte's CC/125 are the primary east/west corridor north of interstate 44.

Greene County, Priority # 6 (from # 7)

Fair Grove, Rogersville. Economic Development. Truck and Commuter parking stations at various locations throughout the county to allow for freight movement. Commuter and Truck Parking-Lighted and Patrolled.

Greene County Planning, Priority #1

Bike and Pedestrian needs on Rte. 125. A crosswalk is needed on Main St. to safely get students from the schools on the north side to the south side. Removed sidewalks to the park and library from future submittals due to approved TAP grants.

Greene County Planning, Priority # 3

Rte's CC/BB from Fair Grove to Walnut Grove. Shoulder widening along the Trans-America Trail.

Suggest

Refer to Public Works Committee to determine if Board of Aldermen should apply and City Engineer to submit TAP grant for installing crosswalk at Main Street/Rte. 125. If TAP funding applied for we should request MoDOT conduct survey if crosswalk appropriate. TAP grant cycle may be closing soon.
