The party leader and founder, Lee Holmes, was a former Conservative activist and prospective Parliamentary Candidate who resigned from the party over the 'omnishambles' of George Osborne's budget, tax cuts for the rich whilst most people are suffering, domination by multi-millionaire, ex-public-schoolboys from the South East and plans for regional pay and benefits which would decimate the North and other English regions.

Lee has previously campaigned at the 2005 General Election for Reg Keys in Sedgefield, where the spin, lies and wars of Tony Blair's Labour party led a coalition of people from across the political spectrum to fight for accountable government and genuine democracy.

Lee says, "It's clear that the three main parties have lost touch with the reality of life in Britain today and govern only for their own vested interests. Across vast swathes of the UK voters have no effective choice as they are faced by one party domination, Tories in the South and Labour in the North."

"The Lib Dems have shown themselves to be as untrustworthy as the rest, and UKIP obsess unhealthily about Europe and have many dubious views far to the right of even the Tories. Yet people are crying out for a democratic alternative, in touch with their lives, and we at the PDP are determined to offer that alternative."
