

Minutes of the Meeting of Nov. 8, 1991

31 members present.

The Commander opened the meeting and then conducted a Veterans Day Memorial program.

The Commander introduced Dominic Damiano who served overseas in the Desert Storm area. He was presented a Certificate of Appreciation by Jack Hawkins Jr. These wooden plaques have been prepared by the Richmond County and are to be given out to all Staten Islanders who were in active service during those hostilities.

After those ceremonies we went into the regular order of business. Minutes of previous minutes were read and were corrected to state that a motion was made for the Post to donate \$300. to the Women's Auxillary and to correct the amount in the checking account.

Committee reports : New member Nick Masosarillo was introduced.

Membership- Carlos Fontana reported that we have 163 members paid which gives us \$100 for the second year in a row. County Membership Chairman Richard Riechart believes we are the first Post on the Island to Achieve \$100.

Post Editor-Jim Thoma reported that he expects to get the paper out next week. Jim was given a round of applause for his good job.

Treasurer-Pete Antiaco gave run down of expenses and income. The previous balance was \$ 4546.83 and the current balance is \$ 4246.83 a decrease of \$ 300.

Correspondence-Letter received from the S.I. Womens Post thanking the Honor Guard for their graveside services for Mrs DePuy. They also donated \$25 in appreciation.

Letter received from County advising that this year's memorial services will be held on Dec. 8, 1991 at the Immaculate Conception Church at 9:30 A.M. The Commander will submit the names of Post members who have died this past year.

No other action taken with the correspondence.

New Business--Charlie Fontana said that the upset election results in Pa. was due to the Democrat pushing for a national health program. This is same positions that Charlie is striving for in doing away with V.A. hospitals and covering Veterans under a National Health Plan.

Jack Hawkins, Jr. spoke on the difficulties that the Korean War veterans are having getting their Memorial built in Washington. He made motion that at the County we put up a resolution to have the County write to our elected Officials that they get them to put pressure on the Battle Field Commission to get this project going. Motion seconded and passed.
