

Hints from Heloise

Or when in doubt play your notes shorter.....

Breathing

- Keep throat open to maximize air flow.
- Try to keep breath speed about the same ---even across low and high notes
- Don't overblow, especially the high notes
- Don't underblow the low notes

Articulation

- Use note length for emphasis, not change of breathing.
- Double tonguing D g D g D g or T k T k T k or D dl D dl D dl Practice in groups of 3 – DgD, gDg, DgD, gDg – to help produce the sound evenly- not Strong/weak

Sight-Reading

Things to look for before playing

- Key Signature, Time Signature, Repeats and Endings
- Changes in meter Hemiolas, 2 to 3 and 3 to 2
- Changes in Time signature where beats change but tactus stays the same
- To help phrasing, look for cadences and breath at the end of the cadence.
 Often a # is a clue to a cadence and/or a 5 to 1 interval in the Bass.
- Try to Count in Big Beats to get a better feel for the flow of the piece


