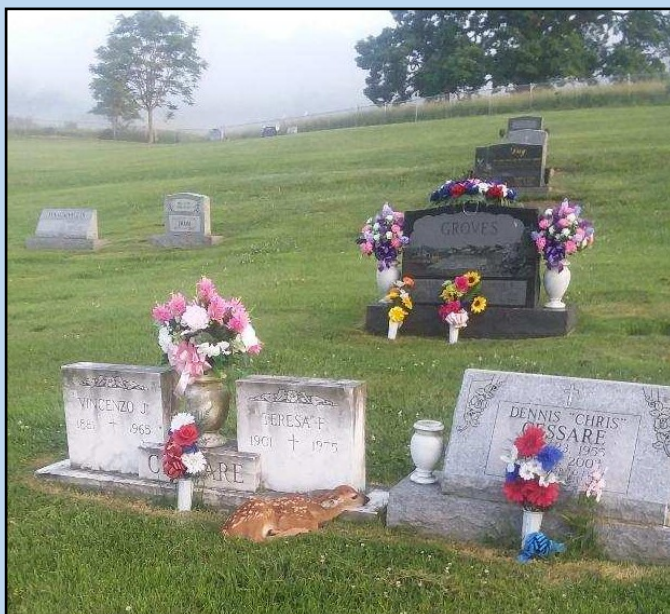
Father’s Day is meant to recall, recognize and remember the endless efforts, initiatives and contributions of all the fathers around us. The qualities of a good father are the following:

Mass Intentions for 2021

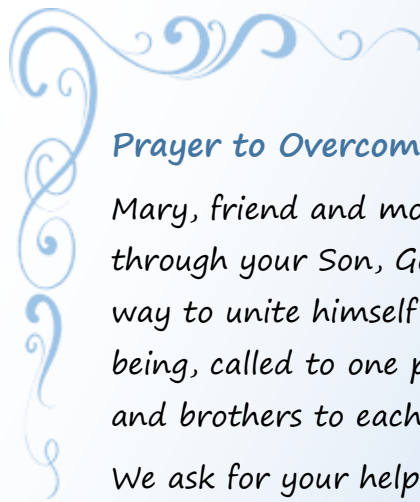
Our Mass intention book for the rest of this year is full, so we will be making the first half of 2021 available now.

The Emmaus Ministry for Grieving Parents will hold a one-day retreat on Saturday, October 17, 2020 at St. Mary Church in Morgantown.

This retreat is designed for grieving parents whose precious children of any age (from conception to old age) have died by any cause (miscarriage, stillbirth, abortion, illness, accident, suicide, murder, overdose, etc.), no matter how long ago.

The retreat agenda includes prayer services, spiritual reflections, breakout sessions, Emmaus Walk, Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, and time for reflection. Find compassion, rest, and peace...at least for a time.
