

RECIPE OF THE MONTH Apple Cranberry Coleslaw

This Coleslaw is so pretty, so easy to make and a great side dish for your Easter dinner and you can make it 24 hours ahead and keep in the fridge.

14 oz bag 3-color coleslaw mix

1 large apple, chopped

1/2 cup dried cranberries

1/2 cup chopped walnuts

4 green onions, sliced

Dressing:

- 3/4 cup mayo
- 3/4 cup plain yogurt or sour cream
- 1/4 cup honey
- 3/4 teaspoon dried, ground ginger Combine coleslaw ingredients in a large bowl. In a small bowl, combine dressing ingredients and mix well. Pour dressing over coleslaw and stir until evenly coated. For a less creamy coleslaw, use 1/2 cup mayo, 1/2 cup plain yogurt, 3 Tbsp of honey, and 1/2 tsp of ginger.
