I Am the Gate (Third Sunday in Lent)

When Jesus said, "I am the gate," he referred to himself as the gate, the opening, the doorway to the abundant life God has for us. Through Christ, we find safety from the dark powers of the world; we find a full, rewarding life with physical and spiritual needs provided. Christ is the door into a new life. How, when, and for what reasons we enter it are individually our own. No one, not even God, can force us to enter. But, one fact is clear — through that gate is meaningful and eternal life, outside it is emptiness and frustration.

Often in our lives we tend to close gates between ourselves and others. When these gates are shut tight, they become walls which cannot be broached. Our pride, our jealousy, our ambition, and our insecurity shut gates which are difficult to open except through Christ. He is the gate through which we all may pass, and through which we learn about opening gates to those around us — gates between family members, gates between generations, gates between races, gates between nations, and gates between religious denominations.

During this season of reflection upon our Christian lifestyles, it is important to examine our actions. Are we gate openers, or do we hide behind our gates?
