HBGP Bull Creek Ranch

The fourth race of the Hillbilly GP season was held on December 12, at Bull Creek Ranch. About 120 riders participated in the motorcycle classes. The course used some of the trails used in October's Hardwood enduro. At six miles in length, it was one of the longest of the Hillbilly series.

Much of the ATV and motorcycle courses were separate. The course started out with approximately half a mile of grass track before the trail hit the woods. The first time around, the motorcycle trail would follow the ATV trail to avoid a bottleneck. On subsequent laps, the motorcycles would turn right and go up an off-camber trail.

About half way around the loop, the trails split and the bikes followed the first half of the first special test used in the Hardwood Enduro. Then, the course split off the enduro trail. Spud and Chili cut some new trail leading to the grass track to finish up the loop.

In fact, due to the length of the course and the fact that December 12th is almost the shortest day of the year, the Pee Wee race held after the second ATV race finished at dark and trophy presentation was held after dark.

In the Pro class, it was Caleb Wohletz winning both motos. Steve Leivan kept Caleb honest. Steve was only 5 seconds behind at the end of the first moto.

Allen Haynes won the A Class with two first place finishes. Not only did Allen win, but he was sponsored for the day. He was riding Terry Brumley's KTM with a Reclus auto-clutch. He like the auto-clutch so much, he had one in his own bike a week later. Kreg Simons and Bart Williams fought for second place with each getting a second and a third. Kreg got second for the day by beating Bart in the second tie-breaking moto.

In the 40+, riders were very consistent with Mike Herbert, Kevin Henslee and Malcolm Wood finishing first, second and third in both motos.



HBGP Cassville

The fifth Hillbilly Gran Prix of 2004-2005 was held at the Dunfee Ranch outside Cassville, MO. There was so much rain leading up to the race, everyone was concerned that the race would be a swamp. But, no, Chili Roberts, Spud's number one trail bitch, assured everyone that the place drained like a toilet. In this case, Chili was right. The only place it got a little sloppy was the parking area. It was nice to have a 4WD truck getting in and out of there.

Not only did the trail hold up well, but the weather was again perfect for the race. It was January 9th. It was sunny and 60 degrees.

The start area is a little short for this race. The pro class only had about 10 yards before they had to make a 180 degree right hand turn around a cedar tree, and with all those exposed roots, you didn't take the inside line. It was sure to take out your front tire.

The all 62 ATVs and 93 motorcycles shared the same course for this race, but not at the same time. As usual, the bikes ran a 45 minute moto, then the ATVs ran a 45 minute moto and then they repeated. The pee wees followed. There was a big pee wee turn out, about a dozen bikes and another dozen ATVs.

The course consisted of lots of rocks, creeks with rocks, creeks with ledges (big rocks), rocky uphills, rocky downhills, rocky off-camber hills with roots (for a little variety) and there was a section with whoops and jumps. All in all, it was a pretty fast course, about 4 miles in length.

Turnout for the Pro class was a little light for this race. Only five riders signed up for the class. All of the prior races have had more than 10 riders in class. Aaron Shaw won both motos to take the overall. Shane Roberts and Zack Bryant swapped the next two positions with Shane winning the final tie-breaking moto for second for the day.

Eight riders entered the A Class. Bart Williams and Travis Pilant would swap positions in the two motos with Bart winning the second moto, he won the class for the day. Bart had a good

second moto coming in almost two minutes ahead of Travis. Steve Underwood with two third place finishes got third in class.

Zack Neill took both motos to win the overall in the B Class. Shane Martin finished second in both motos, finishing second for the day. Chris Goodall, in his second race since coming out of retirement, finished fourth and third for a third in the B Class.

12 riders entered the 30+ class. Matt Ellerman took the win with a first in the first moto and a second in the second moto. Todd Mallow won the second moto and took fourth in the first moto, good enough for second overall. Scott Gragg used a second and fourth to get third overall.

It was Mike Herbert, Malcolm Wood and Kevin Henslee heading thing up again in the 40+ class, finishing in that order in both motos. Mike must have really been hauling to take the first moto by three minutes!

The deck got shuffled in the C Class. David Ross was the most consistent with a third and first to take the win. Dustin McLeod with a second and fourth picked up second for the day. And Jordan "Crash" Whitmer with a fifth and third finished third for the day.

Ryan Hodge, Keith Williams and J.R. Richardson finished in both motos in that order in the Trailrider class.

It was Kole Henslee winning both motos to win the Youth class. Second went to Quinten Tinsley with a fifth and second. Zac Freeman with two fourth place finishes finished third on the day.

I knew I was within 30 seconds of taking another lap. It turns out I needed to complete three laps 24 seconds quicker.
