

In this class you learn a quick and easy way to make half square triangles. Then we select one of several blocks that shimmer and make a lot of them. Then - we audition layouts. There are so many ways these beautiful blocks can be used and all give a lovely flicker of light like water flowing over pebbles. It is super cool!!!

With a simple 'quilt' top with a small piece of a large-scale print, a toning colour, and a lot of plain cream or white you can make an inspirational piece for learning free motion quilting. This class bridges the gap between scribbling on cheap cream fabric and starting free motion quilting on a precious quilt. It uses ideas from an existing fabric to develop quilting patterns which complement your quilt. It is fun, and simple. You will also learn some easy quilting patterns to use as filler stitching between your main designs.
