- ❖ Credit card fees. At the end of the Club's fiscal year that ended June 30, 2018, the Club had incurred almost \$3,500 in credit card service fees. The Board voted at the June meeting to start adding a 3% service fee to every credit card payment made for a luncheon or event sponsored by the Club. When a member or guest calls the Club and uses a credit card, a 3% service fee, based on the amount of the event registration, will be added. For example, the August luncheon of \$30 will have \$1 added.
- ❖ Getting to know you. It is time to update your Yearbook info. - ❖ Annual membership dues were due as of July 1. You can pay by check, cash or credit card and a dues payment form is included in the newsletter for you.

- ❖ <u>Bridge Round Table</u>. Did you know that Bridge Round Table is the only RT that meets through the summer? New members are always welcome!
