The 41st Annual Andersonville Historic Fair and Civil War Reenactment was held on October 7-8, 2017 in the Civil War Village of Andersonville, Georgia. Camps were set up camps and a battle was staged each day.

Gates opened to the public at 10 am both days, with the battles taking place on Saturday at 3pm and Sunday at 2pm. Sutlers selling uniforms, accounterments, guns, swords, flags and civilian clothing of the era added color and interest as did


