## What is Lent and why does it last forty days?



Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. Lent comes from the Anglo Saxon word *lencten*, meaning "lengthen" and refers to the lengthening days of spring. The forty days represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan and preparing to begin his ministry.

Lent is a time of repentance, fasting and preparation for the coming of Easter. It is a time of self-examination and reflection. In the early church, Lent began as a period of fasting and preparation for baptism by new converts and then became a time of penance by all Christians. Today, Christians focus on relationship with God, growing as disciples and extending ourselves, often choosing to give up something or to volunteer and give of ourselves for others.

Sundays in Lent are not counted in the forty days because each Sunday represents a "mini-Easter." This is why you will see the designation "Sunday in Lent" rather than "Sunday of Lent" in the naming of these Sundays. On each Lord's Day in Lent, while Lenten fasts continue, the reverent spirit of Lent is tempered with joyful anticipation of the Resurrection.

The cemetery was an important part of that first gathering. As the women went to the tomb on the first Easter Sunday, these celebrations happened at the graves of the faithful. Some of the early worship services included a time of caring for the cemetery grounds.

While a cemetery may seem to be a morbid place for worship, it serves to remind the congregation that Jesus' resurrection is a foretaste of the resurrection of the faithful still to come (1 Corinthians 15:20-28). If possible, congregations will gather facing east to watch the sunrise. With the coming of a new day, and especially during the early days of Spring, we are reminded of new life.

Some will remember the words of the prophet Isaiah, "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness—on them light has shined" (Isaiah 9:2 NRSV). Sometimes the world around us can seem very dark, but in Christ we have a light of hope, the very presence of God in the midst of us.

Today, United Methodists gather in a variety of places. Some outside and others indoors. Some will bring lawn chairs to a nearby beach. Others will bundle up and gather around a fire to counter the cold of the morning. Still others will enter their church's sanctuary for a special worship experience. Wherever the faithful come together, we gather in the presence of God, to celebrate and give thanks for the gift of our resurrected Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.





Hello Church.

You have probably come across people in your life that have certain characteristics that are not just part of who they are, but it really defines who they are. That the characteristic or personality of the person is so strong that it's hard to imagine the person without it. For good or bad it really becomes their identity.

What defines you in your life? As Christians the resurrection of Jesus is not just another part of the story, nor is Easter just another holiday in the year. The Resurrection of Jesus is a powerful defining event for Christians. Christians began to worship on Sunday's, rather than the Jewish Sabbath (Saturday) because they were defined by Jesus' resurrection. Even through the season of Lent where we are contemplative on our sin and Jesus' death, we pause each week for a celebration of the resurrection day each Sunday.

While our worship life is characterized by Jesus Resurrection, the greater question is whether or not our life is characterized by Jesus' resurrection. Does our life hold to, affirm, and proclaim that God is able to make the broken to become whole, the sick to be well, the lost to be found, and the dead to find life? Does our life hold to the wonderful truth that no matter what we are going through there is hope and life offered to us because of Jesus' resurrection?

May we not just be resurrection people during the season or day of Easter, but may His resurrection define who we are so completely that we are nothing without it. This hope of resurrection is not just for when we die, but to be lived out in life as Paul says in Colossians 3 "Since, then, you have been raised with Christ, set your hearts on things above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things. For you died, and your life is now hidden with Christ in God. When Christ, who is your life, appears, then you also will appear with him in glory."

Let us rise with Him and together bring this hope of resurrection to our world!





#### UKRAINE PROJECT

#### Over \$100,000 in goods have gone to Ukraine

Mission Central continues to supply Ukraine. Items include: gauze pads, medical dressings, antiseptic treatment, alcohol pads, adult diapers, catheters, masks, isolation gowns, syringes, Tylenol and flu medications, sutures, medical needles and more.





Mission Central has partnered with Teknika based in San Jose, CA, who had to close a Ukrainian warehouse in Kharkiv because of the war. Teknika is now collecting and sending items for Ukraine via cargo van to Chicago, and from there by plane into Poland; however, they were struggling to sort through the donations.

Mission Central has a huge base of volunteers and therefore has the ability to supply and sort goods including medical items, disaster recovery supplies and more. God has brought these teams together.

#### • What can you do to assist?

The most important things to do now are praying for those impacted, donating money and spreading the word about what we are doing here. (The more support we can get, the more people we can assist.)

### • Where do the items go?

The items go to soldiers on the front line, those assisting with war efforts and those who are living in Ukraine.

## • Are you helping refugees?

We are not assisting refugees now, although that will be our focus later. We are shifting priorities as needed. Some churches and nonprofits have picked up items to go to refugees, and we will continue to support these efforts.





# **House of Worship Program**

Small donations from a committed congregation can make astounding impact on the lives of those around them. If your church is able to round up 20 participating members, they could receive on average a donation of \$600 a year. Following the 2020-2021 heating season, Aero Energy was able to donate **\$18,511.36** to churches, and with your help we can top that number this year!

#### **Common Questions**

1. If I become a House of Worship Program participant, will I pay more for my fuel?

No, you pay the same price per gallon you are paying now. This is a donation from Aero Energy to your church. Aero Energy donates 4 cents for every gallon of fuel you use, that is all.

2. Does my church need to use propane or heating oil to receive the donation?

No, your church does not need to use propane or heating oil to receive the annual Aero Energy House of Worship Program donation.

3. Does my church need to be an Aero Energy customer in order to receive an Aero Energy House of Worship donation?

No, but they are welcome to switch to Aero Energy and receive four cents in donations for every gallon they use.
