# CHALLENGING THE STATUS QUO!

(Amos 7: 12-15; Ps. 85: 9-14; Eph. 1:3-14; Mark 6:7-13)

Who wants change? Many of us do not like changes! Two years ago when the Church's hierarchy announced that there were going to be changes made in the Roman Missal, many Catholics were upset. Who needs change when we are so used to and comfortable with the status quo? Change in any form is always difficult to handle or to accept. Why try to fix a thing that is not broken? Well, it may not have been broken, but does it serve the interests of all, or only that of a few?

The context of today's first reading tells us about Prophet Amos who called for social justice for all in the society. Amos, a native of Tekoa, lived in the Southern Kingdom of Judah, about six miles from Bethlehem. Although, he was a businessman (a shepherd and a dresser of sycamores), the Lord called him to prophecy in Bethel, the Northern Kingdom, where Amaziah served the king as priest of the Sanctuary. Amaziah was a professional religious person paid by the king - to offer prayers and preside over religious ceremonies in the king's palace. Thus, Amaziah favored a religion that stands for the *status quo*. He was patriotic and loyal and was loath to "rock the boat," which might unsettle the constituency. In contrast, Amos was a layman called by God to preach against the injustices prevalent at his time - he was sent to preach against the *status quo*.

Amos was blunt in his rebuke of the Israelites who have turned away from God by practicing injustice and oppressing the poor and the powerless. He refused to tow the line of the *smooth talkers and praise singers*. He blamed the religious and civil leaders for the social injustices that prevailed at the time. Amaziah, the priest was not happy with his rebukes and ordered him out of Bethel. He slighted him and accused him of coming to preach in Bethel for the sole purpose of making a living. Amos denied that he ever wanted to be a prophet but "the Lord took me from following the flock and said to me, Go, prophesy to My people Israel."

The Church has a mission to preach the Good News and to evangelize. She has the mandate to preach against injustice - to preach love and peace. She has a mission to form and inform consciences. Unfortunately, like Amaziah, some of the Church's leaders have failed to exercise the authority Christ has given to them "over unclean spirits." They have allowed the "unclean spirits" of *relativism* and *political correctness* to flourish in our society. They have chosen to *please the king*, rather than challenge the policies and practices that deny justice to the oppressed, food to hungry, care to the sick, love to the rejected and shelter to the homeless.

The lesson of today's scripture readings points to the fact that the work of the Church is not exclusively reserved to the priests and religious. Like Amos, every Christian has a responsibility to promote social justice. You and I have been sent out "two by two" to preach repentance to all peoples. We must not be content with the status quo, but must emerge from our comfort zones and take our religious and political leaders to tasks for preferring to please the powerful and the mighty, rather than fighting for the rights of the weak, poor and defenseless. We must remember the words of Pope Benedict XVI that "the direct duty to work for a just ordering of society...is proper to the lay faithful (you). As citizens of the State, (you) are called to take part in public life in a personal capacity. So (you) cannot relinquish (your) participation in ...different economic, social, legislative, administrative and cultural areas, which are intended to promote organically and institutionally the common good."


