Belbroughton and Fairfield Parish Council

Fairfield 'Smartwater' - The security marking kits were made available Free of Charge for residents of the Fairfield Ward at drop in sessions held at the Fairfield Village Hall on 19th and 22nd September. This was a successful launch with subsequent activities planned for October and November. The Parish Council thanks the Fairfield Community Association for its work to date. After just 8 days into the launch in September some 44% of homes had received kits. If you are yet to receive yours then please contact the clerk and the Parish Council along with the Fairfield Community Association and Wildmoor Residents Association will arrange delivery for your property.

Traffic speeding measures - Fairfield, Stourbridge Rd. The County Council after pressure have agreed to assess putting in a 40 mph buffer zone at the northern entrance to the village just after the A491 roundabout at the northern entrance to the village. Speed camera warning signs will be erected reminding drivers that this road is regularly monitored by the police.

Traffic calming 'white line' markings on the northern entrance should be in place by Spring 2019 – such work we are advised by the County Council is best done after winter frosts are over.

Footpath Wardens

The Council is seeking 'Volunteer Assistant Wardens' to help Paul maintain the rural footpaths in both Belbroughton and Fairfield. If you have an interest in such a role please contact the clerk.

The Green, Belbroughton – Tree replanting

A 'Working Group' comprised of councillors and local residents is undertaking consultations on the future 'look' of this green space, with the first of these taking place on 22nd October. There will be phased replanting of areas following the removal of trees on the boundary earlier this year.
