The major difference in the types of residency is the level of care required.

National Aquarium introduces visitors to America’s Aquatic Treasures -- aquatic life and habitats preserved and protected by our national marine sanctuaries. There are nearly 70 exhibits with 250 species organized into four gallery sections. The National Aquarium will be closing its doors on September 30 due to renovations to the Department of Commerce Building. The collection of more than 1,500 animals will be transitioned to new homes at either National Aquarium, Baltimore, or at other accredited aquariums.

After accepting an offer to teach at [The Hampton Institute](#), a predominantly African American in southern Virginia, he discovered he could make more of a difference by focusing on his side interest in art, and built up a department, mentoring his most promising art students. The story and the play were a huge success with the CLC residents, many of whom lived in the period and could relate to the story. It was a great afternoon of theater for the Washington, DC VAMC CLC veterans.
