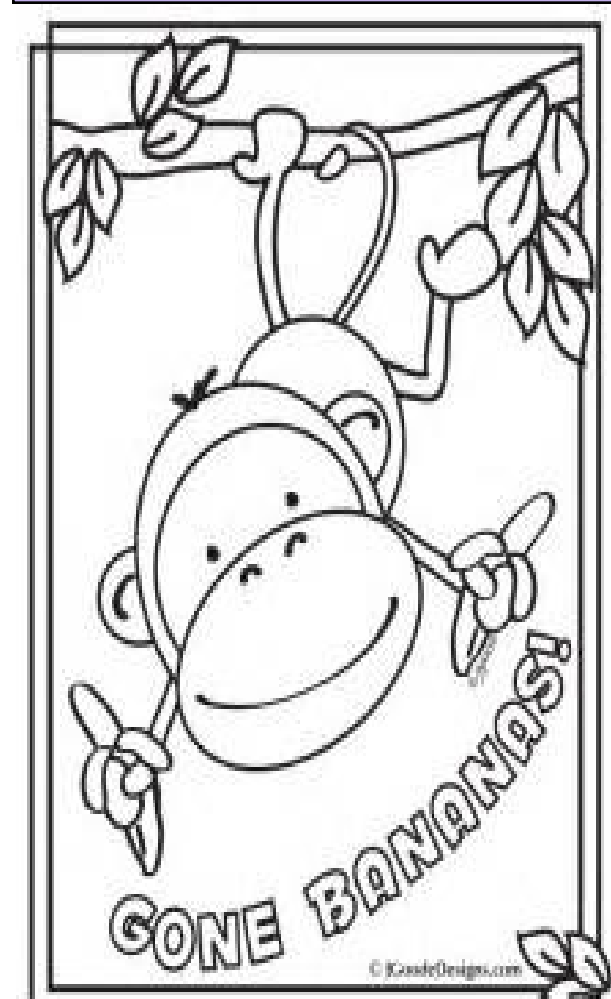

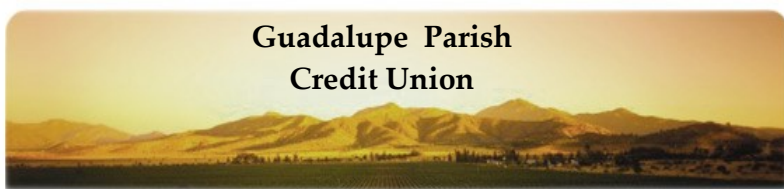

OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE PARISH

Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time



"Repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God."

Theme: The God of History

The theme of "Fiddler on the Roof" is: "Play your little tune in life, but keep your balance and do not break your neck!" This is not always easy for Christians who are citizens of two cities: the earthly one (for example, the United States) and the heavenly one (the Church). We favor separation of the two, but there are areas that overlap. Christians are supposed to be good citizens, pay their taxes, exercise their voting rights, They must love their country, though in certain periods of national history politicians and leaders may turn out to be corrupt. As in all institutions, not even excluding the Church, the human element will always be there. Christians should be concerned about the culture and social well-being of their community.

Today's Bible reading clearly pay tribute to the God of history. God makes use of an evil emperor (in Jesus' time, the Roman Caesar!) as well as a good one (Cyrus, who freed the Jewish exiles in Babylon). We should recognize the God of history in both. "Repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God" (Gospel). The state has his own sphere in promoting communal welfare and in maintaining law and order, but always under God to whom it is responsible. If it over-steps the mark, a Christian is absolved of obedience. We must obey God rather than humans. (Think of social justice, right to life, just war.) Pray for guidance to keep your balance.
