WHAT THE MEDICATION DOES

Prevents blood clots

HOW TO TAKE THE MEDICATION

- 1. Take as directed on the label.
- 2. Take at the same time daily.

SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS TO REPORT TO YOUR NURSE OR DOCTOR

- 1. Bleeding gums
- **2.** Nose bleeds
- 3. Skin bruises easily
- 4. Blood in urine
- **5**. Fever
- 6. Skin rash
- 7. Extra heavy menstrual flow
- 8. Black (tarry) stools
- 9. Vomiting blood

SPECIAL POINTS

1. Do not take aspirin or medication that contains aspirin unless your nurse or doctor tells you.

- Take extra care to avoid bruising or cutting yourself.
 - a. Brush your teeth with a soft toothbrush.
 - **b.** Shave with an electric razor.
 - **c.** Avoid contact sports.
- **3.** Eating different amounts of foods that contain vitamin K can affect the way the medication works. Because green leafy vegetables have vitamin K, you should eat about the same amount each day.
- **4.** Some medication my change the color of your urine.
- **5.** Carry medical identification, with the medication name and dose, at all times.
- **6.** Keep this and all medications out of the reach of children.
