# From the Pastor's Desk

#### Creating a "Fresh Expression" of Church

The Christian movement is today facing one of its biggest challenge – the secularization of society. Even 50 years ago, church attendance was "expected" of most people, and shopping and sports were not even options on Sundays. Today, not only is church attendance no longer expected, but the options for Sunday activities continue to expand. Families with young children are faced with practices and games on Sundays; people running events for recreation and hobby-related groups see Sunday at the optimal day for getting a large amount of participation. Rest, family time, errands, and shopping are often top of list for families.

Studies show that 88% of the people who do not currently have a church home are not "seeking" one, either. And while having better music or better preaching might attract church goers from another church to your church, this is simply member-swapping and not truly advancing the Kingdom.

So what is a church to do if it wants to continue to reach people with the life-giving message of Jesus? We must take the church to where people are already gathering...like restaurants, wine bars, sporting clubs, community club houses, gyms, even tattoo parlors! Our conference has partnered with the "Fresh Expressions" movement which helps train to churches find new and creative ways of taking the church into the community.

We at BUMC are starting our first "Fresh Expression" at the new Hardee's in Belleview, and we're calling it "Hope at Hardee's." Once it is launched, it will meet Tuesdays at 2pm (a time approved by the Hardee's owner), and will feature relevant Biblical conversation and good food. Once we get rolling, we will also celebrate Holy Communion each week. Are you willing to be a missionary for Jesus right here in our community? If so, please let me know as we get ready to launch HOPE AT HARDEE'S. I can't wait to see what Jesus will do!

Other Fresh Expressions will follow. What location is God putting on YOUR heart? Your neighborhood's clubhouse? Your favorite restaurant? Your hiking club?

I ask that each of us pray: In the name of Jesus, may Your Shekinah glory descend and rest on the Hardee's restaurant, it's parking lot, it's tables & chairs, food prep areas, and especially the EMPLOYEES and CUSTOMERS of Hardee's. Fill us your servants with the fire of Your Holy Spirit that we will embody Your presence, You grace, Your love, and Your joy as we converse and live out the incarnational ministry of Jesus. May God's Kingdom COME on earth, as it is in heaven. In the powerful and mighty Name of Jesus.

#### BELLEVIEW UMC EMMAUS FAMILY

The Belleview UMC (BUMC) has experienced significant growth in the Emmaus Community since the fall of 2015. Two men and two women were sent on the Florida Aldersgate Community "Walks to Emmaus" #145, and one young pilgrim on the "Chrysalis Retreat" held at Wayne Willis Methodist Campground, Fruitland Park, FL.

In March 2016 there were two "Walks to Emmaus" #146, one for men and one for women. BUMC sent four men and seven women. Then in April for a women's "Walk to Emmaus" #147, BUMC was again fortunate to send seven women. If you are interested in participating in a future Walk to Emmaus, you need a sponsor. Contact Pastor Kris for more information. She has been responsible for promoting and contributing to this program's growth at BUMC. Thank you!

BUMC now has forty-four individuals, who have either completed an Emmaus Walk, Cursillo, Tres Dias or other recognized experience (twenty-two prior to 2015 and twenty-two since). Because BUMC Emmaus Family has shown this growth and Marion County currently had no representation on the Florida Aldersgate Emmaus Community Board, we were asked to select someone from BUMC to represent Marion County. The board meets the third Saturday of odd months in Orlando. Pastor Kris asked me to be the representative and I accepted. My name is Elaine Gillam, Wilmington Area Emmaus Womens' Walk #31, June 1994, Wilmington, Ohio.

BUMC Emmaus Family is also a member of the Tri-County Emmaus Community (Lake, Marion, Sumpter Counties) that to date have hosted Emmaus Gatherings at New Covenant UMC; however, they would like to spread the hosting to other Churches. We have been asked to host on February 9, 2017 which will be prior to the March 2-5, 2017 Men's Walk #149 and the March 9-12, 2017 Women's Walk #149.

\*The Walk to Emmaus is a spiritual renewal program intended to strengthen the local church through the development of Christian disciples and leaders. The Walk begins with a 72-hour short course in Christianity—fifteen talks by lay and clergy on themes of God's grace, disciplines of Christian discipleship, and what it means to be the church. The course is wrapped in prayer, meditation, worship and Holy Communion. Members of the Emmaus Community support the 72-hour experience with a prayer vigil, by preparing and serving meals and other acts of love and self-giving. Men and women attend separate weekends. Participants are encouraged after their Walk to meet regularly in small groups to challenge and support one another in faithful living, and to seek to Christianize their environments of family, job, and community through the ministry of their congregations. The Upper Room, a ministry unit of the General Board of Discipleship of the United Methodist Church, sponsors the Walk to Emmaus; however, the Walk to Emmaus is ecumenical.

#### Lenten Offering to MTRA

Dear Church Family,

On behalf of the Marion Therapeutic Riding Association (MTRA), I want to thank the entire church family for their generous Lenten donation (\$3,229.98) to MTRA. Our church leaders decided to specify \$2500 to be used to sponsor the horse "Wesley". This money will be used to provide his care for a year. The remainder is sufficient to provide full scholarships for two riders.

Wesley is an exceptional horse. In a class one day, he suddenly stopped and refused to move. After trying several things to get him to move, his leader called the instructor for help. As the instructor approached Wesley and his rider, she noticed that the rider was in the early almost imperceptible stages of a seizure. Wesley had sensed something wrong with his rider and refused to move until the rider was safely dismounted, he then side stepped away and walked off.

This offering makes BUMC a "Secretariat" level giver. The church will be so identified on MTRA's website on the donor's page. The church will receive an 8x10 framed picture of Wesley denoting that fact that we sponsored him. A similar picture will be displayed in MTRA's barn showing that BUMC is the sponsor. Also, placed on the donor/sponsor page of MTRA's website will be a direct link to BUMC's website.

MTRA's mission is "to offer the miraculous benefits of therapeutic horseback riding to persons of all ages and capabilities that are physically, mentally, or emotionally challenged." In addition to our regular classes for students, MTRA's programs include: providing classes for 24 riders at Hillcrest School for Exceptional Children at no cost to the riders or the school,

- providing free lessons for Veterans,
- supporting programs for the Pace Center for Girls,
- ·supporting programs for clients from the Vines Hospital in Ocala,
- ·and a Silver Saddles program for senior citizens who want to learn to ride and work with horses.

BUMC's donation has an immediate impact on all these programs and is going to serve the needs of individuals in our own community. Again, on behalf of MTRA, thank you for this donation.

This love offering was an isolated offering, and not part of any ongoing support plan for the Foundation.
