BE IMITATORS OF CHRIST'S SACRIFICIAL LOVE

(Jer. 31:31-34; Ps. 51:3-4, 12-15; Heb. 5:7-9; John 12:20-33)

In anticipation of His death, Jesus tried to exhort His disciples not to see death as an end but rather, as a door, through which we have to pass through in order to gain entry into eternal life. Thus, He said: "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Amen, amen, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit." Suffering and pain are part and parcel of our human nature! Ultimately, death is an inevitable end! We must all go through it if you and I intend to merit eternal life.

This Sunday marks the beginning of a period of time in our liturgical calendar, known as the *Passiontide* – the two weeks before Easter. During these two weeks prior to Easter, we are called to reflect intensely on the meaning of the death of Jesus and its effects in our lives. Next Sunday is "Passion (Palm) Sunday," which marks the beginning of what is traditionally known as "Holy Week," and culminates in the Paschal Triduum when we take time to ponder the passion and death of Jesus: the shameful death of the cross versus the glory of the Resurrection.

The glory of the resurrection is what you and I will ultimately enjoy, if we are willing to die to self and live for others – the sacrifices that we make – the almsgiving of our time, talent and resources – the prayer of our intimate relationship with God – the fasting of self-giving and dependence on God alone. It is in this vein that the Letter to the Hebrews tells us, "In the days when Christ Jesus was in the flesh, He offered prayers and supplications with loud cries and tears to the One Who was able to save Him from death, and He was heard because of His reverence." Christ was obedient to God the Father, and depended entirely on His love. By doing this, He has taught you and me to always place our trust in God alone, because, "He, Who did not spare His own Son, will give us everything that is good."

The Passion and Death of Christ, therefore, marks the fulfillment of the promise the Lord made through Prophet Jeremiah: "The days are coming...when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. It will not be like the covenant I made with their fathers." In this "new covenant," God, in Christ, took our human form and died for us in order that we may have "life to the fullest." Like Christ, all Christians are called to look beyond the pain and agony of Good Friday and focus rather on the glory and joy of Easter Sunday. We ought to be willing to be transformed by being ready to die to ourselves and live for others. It is by our willingness to imitate Christ in His self-giving love that will assure us of the eternal life He has promised to His followers: "Whoever serves Me must follow Me, and where I am, there also will My servant be."

Christ intends all Christians to be where He is in His glorified body. He wants to draw everyone to Himself. Therefore, you and I must never prefer the *world* and *human glory* to God's love. We must reject the claims of the *world* and be willing to abandon ourselves and be ready to die with Christ so that we can also rise with Him Who is our resurrection and our life.


The first Sunday evening of each month immediately following the 5 p.m. Mass, our Youth Group meets in the McManus Parish Center. All youths age 13 and up are invited.


