St. Paul's Readers, May 16 at 3 pm Please join us on Thursday, May 16, at 3 pm in Trinity Hall as Kim Hoke leads our discussion of The Madness of Crowds by Louise Penny. This mystery is about many things – the effects of a pandemic on society, for one – but mostly it is about family. How to find it in the most unexpected of places. The secrets that we keep from each other. And how far we would go to protect those we love. Chief Inspector Gamache and the village of Three Pines, Quebec, emerge from the pandemic to confront something even more monstrous. The chancellor of the local university is hosting a lecture on statistics. The community considers this a dry topic until they realize that the number crunching concerns the benefits that would accrue from mercy killing. The subject matter polarizes audiences violently with angry crowds gathering on both sides. The lecturer approaches a tipping point, with endorsements from politicians and others who make her radical ideas appear more reasonable, even tenable. The inevitable murder that follows on the stroke of midnight on New Year's Eve strikes painful chords in everyone. No one balances tight plotting, compassion for her flawed characters, and a broader vision of humanity like the author Louise Penny.
