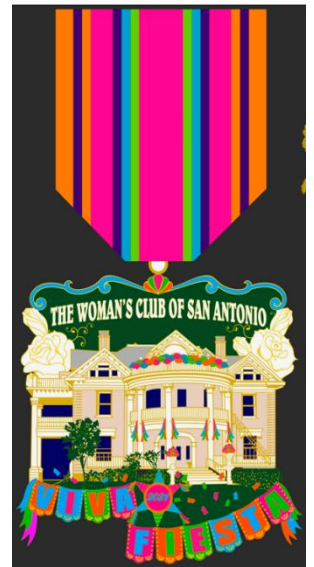

Program: Dr. Michelle Tabit, Ph.D, "Don't Forget the Ladies: Tennessee the Final State", Celebrating the Ratification of the Nineteenth Amendment

Our speaker, Dr. Tabit, is an associate professor of history at the University of the Incarnate Word. She maintains an active research agenda that focuses on using popular culture to teach history. She presents annually at the American Popular Culture Association's international conference and recently published an essay "Where No Woman Has Gone Before: Kathryn Janeway Breaking the Glass Ceiling or Reinforcing Stereotypes?" She is an active member of the UIW community, a member of the Women and Gender Studies Advisory board and regularly teaches women's history. Tabit holds a PhD in history with an emphasis on US and women's history, with a master's degree in Public History. Both degrees are from Washington State University.

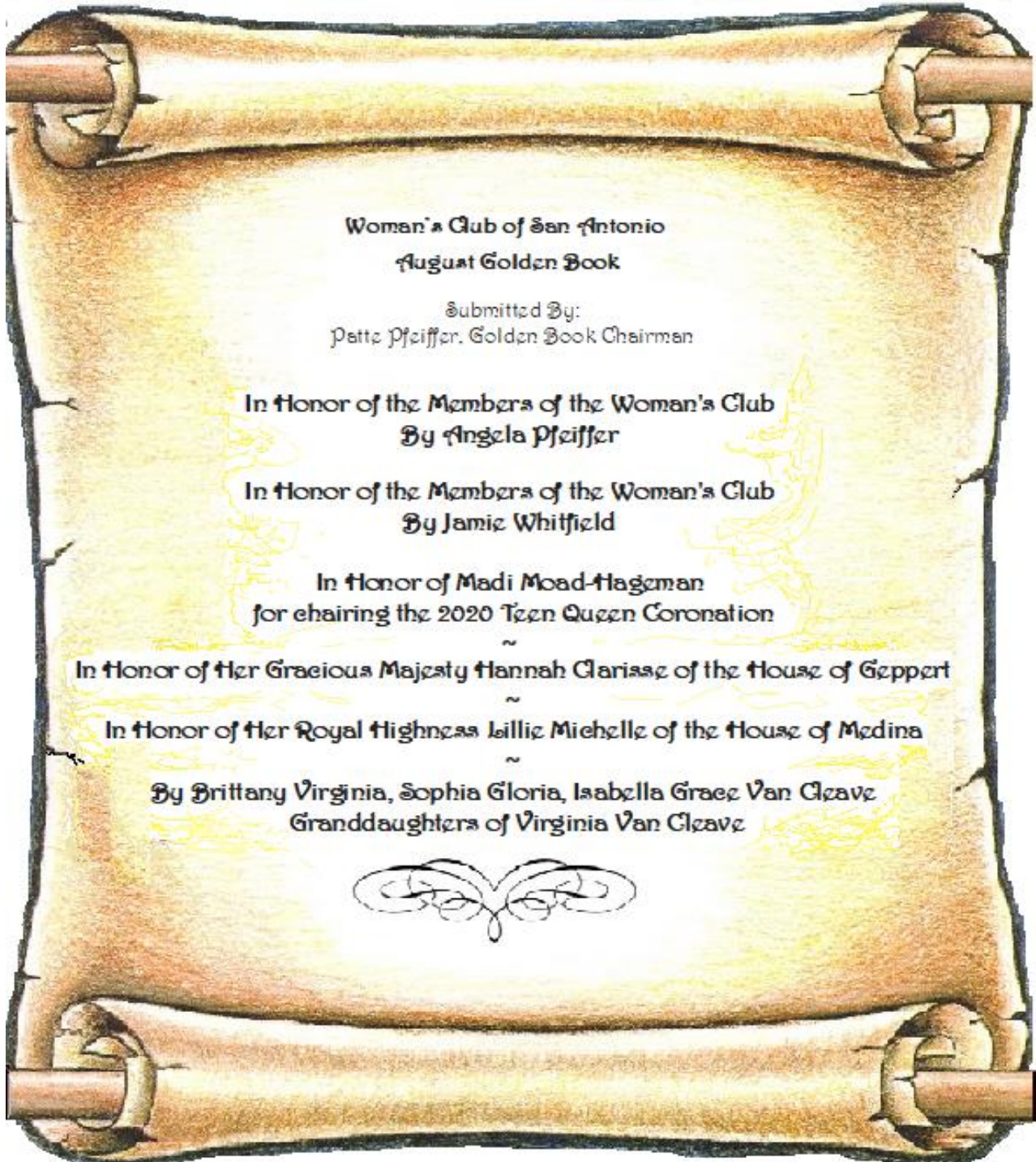

Hello members of the Woman's Club. I am Isabella Marina Niño. I am 17 years old and attend Alamo Heights High School as a Senior. My parents are Carlos & Yvonne Niño, Woman's Club member. My Grandparents are Jerry & Armandina Sifuentes, Woman's Club Member. I've enjoyed being a member of the Ingénue Round Table and have participated in the Coronation for the last 7 years. The Fiesta Flower Show is one of the most exciting events in which I placed 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup>. I have represented the Woman's Club in the River Parade, the Battle of Flowers Parade and the Alamo Pilgrimage. Every Christmas, I enjoy participating in the Christmas Party for the Respite Care children at the beautiful historic Woman's Club house. I would like to extend my appreciation to all the Members for allowing me to represent you in the past and hope to continue to represent you as your future Teen Queen for 2021.

I have accomplished the following awards: The National Honor Society, the National Arts Honor Society, the National Spanish Honor Society, the Presidential Volunteer Service Award – Gold level (500 hours). I received the Students of the Year Candidate Award and Mission Award for the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society. I have been a member of Girl Scout Troop 77 for 13 years and accomplished the Bronze, Silver and Gold Award, as well as the Trifecta Award which is the highest achievement. As my Gold Award I created a movement to spread awareness to prevent child hot car deaths which is called #C.A.R.E. four steps to save a child's life - Child Alert Review Exit.

In January 2019, as a Candidate for Students of the Year for the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society, I coordinated 13 fundraisers, supervised 16 team members, volunteered 550 hours of community service and raised funds over \$22,000 in 7 weeks to help find a cure for blood cancers. This experience has led me to minor in non-profits and to one day have my own non-profit organization. During this pandemic and these times of uncertainly, blood cancer patients and their families need our help more than ever. I have dedicated myself during this time as the Campaign Manager for Dr. Brandi Lindsey, DDS, for the Man & Woman of the Year Campaign 2020 for the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society. I will also continue to be on the Task Force Leadership Team for the second year and mentor the LLS Students of the Year Candidates for 2021.

I am a member of the CBC Church and Campus Life Youth Group. I was Former Chaplain and I am presently the Ways & Means Chairperson of the CRT - Alamo Couriers Chapter. I am a Junior Member of the Canary Island Descendants Association for 17 years. I am a Junior Member of the Fiesta Commission for 7 years. In 2011 I was former Princess for Feria De Las Flores LULAC #2. In 2019 I was Vice President of Alamo Heights Student Council. I am also a Junior Member of the Conservation Society of San Antonio for 2 years. I also take part in the Alamo Heights community service group Teens Give Back for the past 4 years helping feed our homeless and single parent families, Under the Bridge and Snack Pack 4 Kids.

In closing, it would be an honor to represent the Woman's Club of San Antonio as your Teen Queen for 2021. It is my greatest hope that we can all overcome this pandemic and make up for Fiesta 2020!!

# Sophia Christiansen

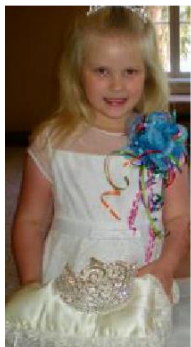


Hello! My name is Sophia Christiansen and I am a senior at Reagan High School. I am so grateful for all of the wonderful Woman's Club members that I have met who are amazing mentors and friends! The Woman's Club Mission Statement "for mutual improvement and cooperation in all charitable and educational undertakings that pertain to the greater good of humanity" is very important to me because I love to serve others in the community.

I have volunteered in many ways with The Woman's Club. I have been very involved with The Ingénue Round Table including volunteering each year at the annual Christmas party that the Ingénues host for the children of Respite Care of San Antonio, a Woman's Club charity. I also select the gifts the children receive at the party and coordinate the gift wrapping to ensure each child has a special gift. I expanded my involvement with Respite Care by partnering with a business called Hardy Oak Storage and I created a Supply Drive where storage customers donated needed items. I picked up the donations and delivered them to Respite Care throughout the year. This past December, I loaded and delivered a U-Haul truck full of needed supplies, books, toys, bikes and furniture for the children at the Respite Care home. I was proud to make a direct positive impact on the lives of the Respite Care children. I served and cleaned up at numerous Woman's Club luncheons, worked in the kitchen assembling food, worked on cleaning the club house several times including dusting baseboards and oiling the woodwork, decorated the club for holidays, worked at The Woman's Club garage sale, help run the games for the Soirée Round Table Christmas parties, helped with the setting up of many club receptions (Agarita Reception along with Coronation and Queen's Receptions), made icing for the gingerbread houses & cookies for the Christmas Faire, participated for multiple years in the Flower Show & Pilgrimage to the Alamo, represented the club in the River Parade & Battle of Flowers Parade, donated to the Restoration Fund, and volunteered in The Woman's Club office answering phone calls & making copies. I have participated in the annual Woman's Club Fiesta Coronation for 14 years since I was four years old.



I serve as a Team Captain of my high school's Varsity Swim Team earning Academic All District and Academic All State distinctions. I have been involved on my club swim team for 12 years and I am a certified Water Safety Instructor, so I truly am an advocate for women in sports and educating children in water safety. I give weekly swim lessons to young children, including two children with Down syndrome, because I am passionate about water safety. Drowning is the leading cause of unintentional and preventable death in children ages 1 to 4. I believe that water safety is important and that every child should learn how to swim in a safe and fun manner. I volunteer as a swim coach to children for a summer league swim team to help improve their skills, coach swim clinics, and work as a lifeguard. I am a Vice President of the National Honor Society (NHS) at my school. I love this leadership position because I am in charge of organizing volunteer opportunities for NHS members including work with Animal Care Services. I was honored by the Reagan High School PTA with the Remarkable Rattler Award, given to students for outstanding contributions and achievements. I serve my fellow students as a senior Class Officer and have served as a Class Officer the past 3 years. I also volunteer as a Sunday School teacher to elementary school children at my church and have done so for the past 6 years. I am a member of the National Spanish Honor Society and National Science Honor Society.



My grandmother, the late Jeanette Atkinson, served on The Woman's Club board and was very involved with the club as is my sister's Godmother/cherished friend Diane Lewallen who invited my grandmother and mother to join the club many years ago. My mother, Johanna Christiansen, has served on The Woman's Club board several times. She is a very involved member of the Woman's Club serving as Counselor of Round Tables, Chairman for multiple years of the Queen's and Coronation Receptions, a member and officer of several Round Tables and served as Golden Book Chairman. I plan to attend Texas A&M University and major in Biomedical Science with hopes of becoming an orthopedic doctor working in sports medicine to develop ways to prevent sports injuries and to continue to promote women participating in sports.
