

Parish Membership: Every family and single adult to be considered active members of St. Bartholomew's Parish must be properly registered in the parish, receiving and regularly using the parish weekly donation envelopes. Only in this way can the parish issue documents attesting to parish membership and Catholic practice, e.g. a letter to be a Godparent or Sponsor. New parishioners are requested to visit the parish office.

Sick & Shut-ins: The priests are available to administer the Sacraments to those who are unable to come to Church. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is part of the healing ministry of the Church, and should be received early in an illness or before a serious operation.

Baptisms: Please call the parish office to make arrangements.

Marriages: In order to provide sufficient time for the Marriage Preparation Course, please call the parish office and ask to speak with the pastor at least six months in advance of the wedding.

A GLIMPSE OF HIS GLORY



Matthew's Transfiguration was proclaimed early this year on the Second Sunday of Lent, its "glimpse of glory" meant to assist our Lenten journey towards Easter rebirth. Now, just before summer turns to autumn, it provides encouragement for the longer-than-Lent pilgrimage and struggle of life itself.

Historically linked to the Feast of Tabernacles, there is a triumphant note of harvest ingathering. The "dying" required for any harvest is not far below the surface. Matthew alludes to the Passion in the descent from the mount after the glimpse of glory passes: "Do not tell the vision to anyone until the Son

of Man has been raised from the dead" (Matthew 17:9). Each disciple must embrace Christ's passion, our only pathway to the Transfiguration's promise of human nature restored in Christ. Icons show the white of Christ's robe spilling onto the robes of Peter, James, and John, the



Master's glory shared with His disciples. But these same disciples accompany him to Gethsemane. Becoming light from and with the Lord requires that the disciples be burned by the purifying, transforming light of the Passion.

In the second reading, Peter gives his eyewitness account of the Transfiguration, together with wisdom gained in the time since he came down from the mountaintop. He reminds us to attend to the Transfiguration's glimpse of glory "as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts" (2 Peter 1:19).

What peak experience do you hold onto, or what experience holds onto you? How does it help you when it is time to bear your cross and share in Jesus' passion?

THE HOMEBOUND

St. Bartholomew's Parish wishes to show our love and care for our members who for reasons of health or infirmity cannot be with us as we gather for Mass each



week. Our aim is for all parishioners who are homebound, permanently or temporarily, to be visited by a Priest or an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion on a regular basis.

Often we will hear of someone who is homebound and has not been receiving the Eucharist for a long time, although this individual may have been, during healthier times, a very devout Catholic. Often we will hear that the person did not want to "bother anyone" or put anyone out." Often these individuals become our "hidden

Catholics' and we sometimes don't learn of them until years later when we celebrate their funeral liturgy.

We want our sick and homebound to know they are valued members of our parish and we want to bring Jesus to them. However, we need your help. These individuals are often hidden in our community and only a neighbor knows of their presence. Please help by personally contacting those homebound Catholics whom you know of and tell them of our availability and deep desire to bring the Eucharist to them. We are flexible and very willing to work around their personal needs and schedules.
