Dear Church Family and friends,

I just heard the word that there is yet another new variant of the COVID 19 virus. I'm sure you are with me thinking that this COVID pandemic should have been mostly in the rearview mirror by the beginning of September; and here we are, in October, and still COVID is a top news story. WHEN WILL IT END?

It is beginning to look like – never, or at least not for a long, long time. "a more realistic epidemiological endpoint might arrive not when herd immunity is achieved but when countries are able to control the burden of COVID-19 enough that it can be managed as an endemic disease." What does this mean, "an endemic disease?" According to the Mailman School of Public Health from Columbia University, "An endemic is a disease outbreak that is consistently present but limited to a particular region. This makes the disease spread and rates predictable." Just like these viruses, there is a vaccine available, but the disease will continue to be a threat. A threat that will eventually not affect the general society so we can begin functioning back to some kind of normal. At some point, we can all hope and pray that this disease will be wiped out like smallpox. Most of us older that 50 have a small pox vaccine mark on our upper arm. But younger than that - no vaccine required because the disease is virtually non-existent on planet earth. Covid will be a fear for the world, but one that we will learn to live with.

I was thinking about comparing the Covid virus to sin. Once sin was unleashed in the world, it has never gone away. There is truly no way to escape it. And once sin has a hold on our lives, there is no way to get out of it. We can't have a vaccine for sin. We are born into sin and live there all our lives.

Whoa – pretty depressing! There is no vaccine to prevent sin, but unlike Covid there is a complete cure available to everyone if you are willing to take the medicine. It is called repentance and forgiveness. We as Christians believe that we can be completely forgiven from any sin if we turn our backs on the sin and ask God for forgiveness through Jesus' death on the cross. Unfortunately, there may be lingering effects from our sinful choices; but once again, God is in the business of taking terrible situations and turning them to good as we move into the grace of God's love.

One more last thought – unfortunately – there are an unlimited number of variants of sin. We can "catch" sin again and again, but we can become more resistant to it as we grow in the grace of God's love through prayer, Bible study, meditation and Christian fellowship.

I encourage you to accept God's forgiveness and grow in your faith to become resistant to sin in your life.

Accepting these Leads to the peace Of God.



Emergency Preparedness

Disaster can strike anyone, anywhere at any time. Natural disasters such as floods, hurricanes, tornados, blizzards, ice storms and earthquakes often wreak havoc on large areas. Man-made disasters such as chemical spills, explosions and plane crashes affect smaller areas but often require emergency evacuations that can last a week or more.

Sadly, experience shows that when disaster strikes, many households are totally unprepared for either being without utilities and services, or, an emergency evacuation for multiple days.

Being unprepared means, at the very least, risking considerable discomfort for multiple days, and at the very worst, risking your health and even death.

Emergency officials urge that every household should <u>at least</u> be prepared for:

- 1. Being stranded at home without utilities for 3 to 5 days.
- 2. Having to evacuate within 5 minutes and not return for at least 72 hours.
- 3. Being stranded overnight in a vehicle.
