






SCHOLASTIC BOOK FAIR at BHPCNS

Parent referrals are what have kept our classrooms full for 66 years. We love meeting new families. They are welcome to tour the school and learn more about our program by calling the office at 301-365-2909.

Children must be 2 years old by September 1, 2024 to be eligible for enrollment at BHPCNS. Siblings are given priority over families new to BHPCNS. Acceptance or Wait List notifications will be sent home in late January 2024.



REGISTRATION FOR CURRENTLY ENROLLED STUDENTS

Registration for children currently enrolled at BHPCNS began Monday, December 4th. Applications received between Monday, December 4th and Friday, December 8th will be given priority in enrollment.

Please recognize that children currently enrolled in our Cub Club, 2s' and 3s' programs, as well as those children who are enrolled in the Pre-K program, but are not age-eligible for Kindergarten, are guaranteed a place, however, it may not be your first choice.

We are busy processing the applications we have already received and will get acceptance status sent home in late January.

BHPCNS follows Montgomery County Public Schools with regard to birthdate cut-off dates for admission.

Children must be...

2 by September 1, 2024 to enroll in the 2s,

3 by September 1, 2024 to enroll in the 3s,

4 by September 1, 2024 to enroll in Pre-K.

Your child's teacher will be sending out a SignUpGenius Link for you to select your conference time. For families with more than one child we will work with you, as best we can to have conferences for both your children on the same day.

Here are some tips to get the most out of the conference experience.

- Conferences are scheduled for 15 minutes. Please be on time or notify the office if you are running late for your conference. If you think you will need more than 15 minutes, please make special arrangements with your child's teacher in advance to have a longer discussion.
- Prior to conference a survey will be sent home for families to share topics they would like to cover at the conference.
- Conferences may be in person or set up as a phone/conference call or via Zoom. Please indicate your preference when you sign up.
- Conferences are for adults only. All BHPCNS classes will be held during conferences. Babies are welcome to attend, however baby-sitting arrangements should be made for older siblings.
- Conferences are an opportunity for BHPCNS to share your child's strengths, concerns, readiness, with you and for you to share what's special, unique or concerning you about your child.
- The Director of the school, Liz Sobrino, will work with the teachers to ensure we are providing the best
 possible experience for your child. It's possible Liz will sit in on your child's conference to learn more about
 your child, support a teacher, offer ideas on your child's development. Please, do not worry if she is at your
 conference. She is there as a resource, support, educator, for your child and family.
- Please let Liz know if you have any questions or would like her to participate in your child's conference. Working together as a team is important to each child's progress in preschool.






LOST & FOUND BINS

AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE (3-year-old & Pre-K) with Mrs. Goodstein

Mrs. Goodstein reports: In January in ASL we are going to learn all about the weather. We will talk about our favorite seasons and follow along with a maple tree as it transitions from Spring to Summer to Fall and to Winter.

This session of Cub Club is sure to have lots of music and movement. We look forward to meeting our newest tiniest Bradley Bears!

MUSIC (3-year-old & Pre-K) with Little Hands

Our Little Hands Winter semester, "Ponies, Piggies and Pups!" focuses on some old familiar barnyard friends with lots of new music and adventures! This month we'll explore the sounds and galloping of horses - fast/slow, stop/go! Your child will use their listening ears to hear the musical cues and then coordinate their body to respond appropriately. "Pony Macaroni" loves to trot and then stop! Have some fun galloping at home (a preparatory skill to skipping), and try switching the lead leg. This works both sides of the brain and body equally!

In January music classes we'll play with woodblocks, tambourines and sticks matching the steady beat - a foundational skill for all music-making. SCIENCE (3-year-old & Pre-K) with Mrs. Mac 'N Cheese



Our cubs will look to the weather for inspiration in January. We will study different winter habitats and the animals who live in them. What parts of the world are covered in snow? What animals live there? What survival skills have these animals developed?

SINGING with Ms. Casey (all ages)

How about that concert! 14 songs is a long setlist for anyone and the children knocked it out of the park. They truly enjoy performing for loved ones. Thank you for showing them how much their hard work means to you. The 4s (and now 5s!) revel in learning that they're now the "big kids" and see the value in leading. For many, it's also their first time performing in front of an audience, which builds confidence as well as concentration. The younger children have enjoyed learning holiday songs for the first time. They're getting increasingly more comfortable at dancing in front of people and sharing their stories from home. Finding our voice is a big part of music class. In January we finally get to dip our feet into...snow boots! - and all of the songs celebrating the new season of pink noses and chilled toes-es. Happy new year & new music to all!

Travel Agent Mydlarz reports: Welcome to Uganda - the Pearl of Africa! Our little travelers packed their backpacks and left for a new continent. For the next couple of weeks we will discover this Central African country known for its beauty, stunning scenery, wildlife and mountain gorilla. English, second to Swahili, is the country's official language, so it would be quite easy for all of us to go out and about and maybe even make friends with Ugandan children. Our Cubs will have a lot of fun going on safari in search of wild animals hidden around our playgrounds.

Next our explorers will change climates and voyage to Antarctica. The coldest and the driest continent in the world is not really an inviting place, especially in winter. Nonetheless, the children will have a lot fun with this snowy environment. We will learn how animals and scientists who live there can survive six months without sun and an average temperature of -58 F in winter. We will experiment with blubber and ice cold water, make our own penguins and even eat some penguins too (Oreo ones, no worries!).
