As I said last month, I intend to lift up a quote each month from Martin Luther since he used his pen to so drastically change the world. I thought this quote (below) was particularly fitting as we move from Reformation into November and its focus on Thanksgiving and gratitude.

“From the beginning of my Reformation I have asked God to send me neither dreams, nor visions, nor angels, but to give me the right understanding of His Word, the Holy Scriptures; for as long as I have God’s Word, I know that I am walking in His way and that I shall not fall into any error or delusion.” – Martin Luther

As we think about things for which we are grateful, it seems that God’s Word is one at the top of the list. As Luther stated, God’s Word guides us so profoundly in our lives. I am reminded how staying grounded in Scripture reading (and prayer) helps us in so many ways. For one thing, it reminds us to approach all of life with gratitude. As I said to the kids in a children’s message recently, we can rejoice in all things – even sadness, anger, and fear – because we know God is with us.

Many people practice having an attitude of gratitude throughout the month of November; to celebrate Thanksgiving beyond just one day or one meal. Some people do this by writing about something for which they are thankful daily. This can be on Facebook, in a journal or even just by thinking about it. Forcing yourself to think about something you are thankful for on a daily basis opens your eyes to the blessings that are all around you. It also can become a habit and become something you start doing more than just once a day.

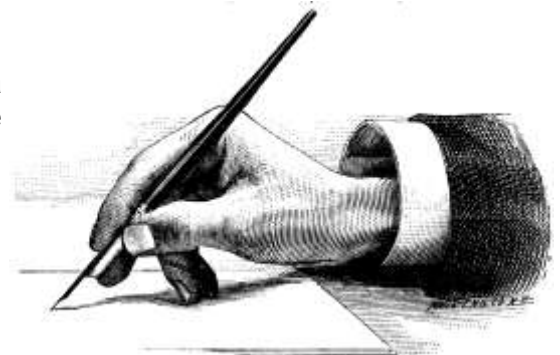
Author Ann Voskamp writes about this very thing in her book “1000 Gifts”. She talks about the joy and happiness that she attains through giving thanks to God for a multitude of experiences and situations in her life (and not all of them are so good – some even quite terrible). She points out that “remembering and giving thanks is the core of our Christian faith.” When we keep remembrance and thanksgiving at the core of who we are, we can experience the fullness of God’s grace and love. And isn’t that just the best way to live?!

I encourage you (maybe even challenge you) to try giving thanks for one thing in your life every day during the month of November. You can keep track them if you wish, but you don’t have to. (Although, this might help you not repeat things. ;D) And try to get deeper than the superficial blessing we so easily and readily jump to.

One thing is for sure – I give thanks for each of you! Y’all are a huge blessing in my life and I’m grateful that God has brought me here.

We discovered it can be very difficult to listen without judgment, yet that is what we are called to do. We have learned that we all have personal biases and prejudices that often get in the way of knowing others, yet we must learn to overcome those biases so we can “really” know and understand them. We read, listened to and studied three scriptures from the book of Acts and discovered that relationships, cooperation and adventure were values that resonated with us. We asked for your input in a congregational assessment and survey and would like to thank everyone who participated in either or both. We have now finished reviewing the results and are getting ready to move on to our next step, speaking with focus groups with the purpose of discovering how or if the results resonate with the congregation. If you are approached to be part of a focus group, we ask you to prayerfully consider participating. If you are not approached but would still like to participate, please get in touch with anyone on the team. Your voices are important and we want to hear what you have to say!

## STEWARDSHIP beyond the horizon



We all know we are incredibly blessed. Too often we do not see, or choose not to open our eyes, to the countless opportunities to be a blessing to others. When we make a more conscious effort to focus on those who cross our path, we begin to realize that **often there is divine purpose** in what we would have previously written off as mere coincidence. When we move beyond casual conversation, we begin to recognize how our time, skills and resources can help someone in need. **We begin to recognize why God placed them in our path.**

When we move beyond the cloistered comfort of focusing on our self, we enable our self to be an instrument of the Holy Spirit. When we engage the world, we feel the power of the Holy Spirit at work in and thru us. **We witness lives changed because we changed from passive to active.**

International education ministry comes with a **warning!**

If you get involved - **be prepared for a miracle.** The miraculous happens when a young boy or girl living in poverty achieves education goals previously unattainable. As they change so do you. What you initially viewed as an **expense** will show its true value when you recognize that your commitment is a **priceless investment in human lives.**



As an instrument of God, you give them love, encouragement, hope, and the gift of education to change their lives for decades into the future. That is a legacy that lives way beyond the date that the donor is called to account for their stewardship of God's gifts. That is a legacy that helps break the cycle of poverty and raise the level of human dignity.
