COMMON SENSE CORNER

- CHARCOAL GRILLS when using a charcoal grill, cool coals should be discarded properly.
 Do not discard in the common area. This includes the drainage areas.
- **2. LITTER** Please keep our community looking clean and neat. This is your home! Please do not litter and if you see litter, please pick it up. This includes parking areas along with the common areas.
- **3. TRASH CANS** Trash pickup is every Monday (if Holiday, the following day) by Waste Management. The garbage containers can be put out on Sunday evenings and **must be returned to the garage no later than Tuesday Noon.** Non-compliance is subject to fines. See the Rules and Regulations.
- **4. NO PARKING ON THE GRASSY AREAS** We are having a problem with people parking on the street and it is destroying the grass, which in turn costs money to repair. Please remember parking on the streets is a towable offense (at owner's expense).
- **5. DELINQUENCIES** Unpaid maintenance fees and assessments has a chain reaction affect: a) people not being able to get financing; b) ability to sell property; and c) it affects the budget and your maintenance fees. As a result the Board contracted a Collection Agency to collect the outstanding balances at the owners expense. If you are in arrears, contact the Board to make arrangements for payment.

Dog urine kills grass! Please don't tether your dog.

Dog waste can contain disease-causing germs and viruses that

Could result in exposure to parvovirus, salmonella, E. coli and more. It sometimes contains parasites like roundworms, hook-



worms, or tapeworms. When it rains, the deposit left behind on the ground is ultimately washed into storm drains. This untreated water goes straight into area streams and rivers. It is estimated that two or three days' worth of droppings from about 100 dogs can contribute enough bacteria to temporarily close a body of water and all watershed areas within 20 miles to swimming and fishing. So, cleaning up after pets does matter.

REACH ALERT — To improve our ability to communicate with you, we have made a special arrangement with Reach Alert to provide an easy to use notification service. We encourage every resident to register for this service. Registration is simple and takes about one minute to complete. You decide how you want to receive our alerts: text message, voice advisories, and/or e-mail. All you need to do is:

- 1. go to www.reachalert.com to register for the service.
- 2. Click on CREATE ACCOUNT
- 3. Follow the prompt and enter your contact information
- 4. Enter <u>Pinnacle Gardens</u> when asked which network you want to join. As you type, our name will appear in the drop-down list. Just click on our name.
