# Lucky Lotto News

## **Legal Challenge Fails**

Someone in Chatsworth, California, is officially a recordsetting lottery loser. With a court ruling this summer, a Los Angeles man lost his bid to claim a \$63 million SuperLotto Plus jackpotthe largest jackpot in state history to go unclaimed. The man, Brandy Milliner, sued the state, alleging he bought the winning ticket. However, Los Angeles Superior **Court Judge Yvette Palazuelos** dismissed Milliner's lawsuit based on evidence provided by the state that his ticket wasn't legitimate. According to the California Attorney General's Office, the winning ticket was purchased Aug. 8, 2015, at convenience store in Chatsworth, while Milliner's ticket was bought at another store in Los Angeles a month earlier. Deputy **Attorney General Neil Houston** argued that experts could tell where Milliner's ticket was bought by examining its paper stock.

# Player Scores 9 Wins in One Day

Luck was certainly on the side of a Massachusetts man who won nine separate \$100,000 grand prizes from a single lottery drawing with the same numbers he's played for more than two decades. Robert Lundstedt, 56, of Brockton, said he had a strange feeling about a recent Mass Cash drawing, so he bought identical tickets at a supermarket, a corner market and a convenience store. The next morning, he checked the numbers and discovered that all five of his picks—1, 7, 11, 26 and 30 matched. Once Lundstedt found out he had won, he called his wife, Virginia, and told her to come home. When she arrived, he first showed her a single ticket. "Oh, my God, Rob, you finally won!" she told him, according to the Boston Globe. But he said, "nope" and started plunking down the other tickets. "He kept throwing tickets in front of me and I'm, like, 'Oh my God, are you kidding me?' It was crazy," his wife said. Lundstedt, a carpenter, gave two of the tickets to his kids, Kristen, 24, and Brian, 21, which still leaves him with \$700,000 in winnings, before taxes. He plans to pay off the mortgage on his home and his children will put the money toward their student loans, he said.

### **Educational Treasure** Hunt

Combing the beaches for treasures washed up during storms became even more fun for kids in South Australia when they played an interactive environment game called Beachcombing Bingo. Families played the game at pop-up events run by Natural Resources Adelaide and Mt Lofty Ranges, an Australian organization that works with the community, industry and government to manage the environment in ways that achieve a balance between the need for resources and the needs of the environment. Designed for kids up to 12 years old, Beachcombing Bingo provided Bingo cards with clues describing different types of things that could be found washed up on the beach. When a row of items was found, the kids would call Bingo and win a prize. As the game progressed, the discoveries-shells, sponges, seaweeds and more-were gathered for a group discussion.

#### **Fundraiser Supports Retired Horses**

A Bingo fundraiser was held at The Loft at Lagunitas Brewing Company in Petaluma, California, by Strong's 2nd Chance Ranch, a non-profit sanctuary for horses that have been retired from their "first careers," often in the world of sports. It was a fun night of Bingo and beer with a dash of comedy from standup comic Deb Campo, who led attendees through a series of Bingo games with an array of prizes. Catered food from Lagunitas came with \$30 ticket, along with the first two Bingo cards. At 2nd Chance, horses are given care and attention, and space to heal, and are trained for suitable second careers or readied for adoption by qualified horseowners.

## **TV Personality Plays Supreme Court Bingo**

Comedian Stephen Colbert says he had a good time watching President Donald Trump's U.S. **Supreme Court nomination** announcement. During his opening monologue on The Late Show, Colbert revealed his winning "Trump Nomination Bingo" card, after the president named Judge Brett Kavanaugh to replace retiring judge Anthony Kennedy. Pulling the card from of his pocket, Colbert said, "You see, all the squares say 'white guy." After calling Kavanaugh a "cover model for Generic Dads Monthly," Colbert said he also played a drinking game during the nomination event. "I would pour myself a drink every time my glass was empty," he joked.

#### **Brits Share Bingo Via Facebook Live**

A virtual Bingo hall has been created to connect a group of senior residential facilities in Great Britain. Ideal Carehomes—a group of 16 adult assisted living communities that offer personalized service to small groups of adults—used Facebook Live to stream the Bingo games and connect residents from each home, creating friendships across the country. The goal was to give the residents of the homes—which typically have no more than 10 residents per facility to create a more personal, home-style living environment—an opportunity to meet their "neighbors" in similar homes. Ideal Carehomes plans to continue the Bingo events and add others, such as an upcoming live quiz show with trophies that can be passed around to winners in all the homes.

# **Bingo Sickness**

Hi Guy,

I hope you will share this letter in your column which I am writing to all the future sick people out there who don't have enough sense to stay home when they are ill so they will get better sooner and in the meantime not infect other people while they are sick.

During the fall and especially during the winter, it seems like social gathering places like Bingo halls are more like hospital wards than places to play Bingo.

Why are people so thoughtless about coming to Bingo and sneezing and coughing their germs all over everyone? I just don't get it.

First of all, when you're sick, it takes so much extra energy to even get up and go out of the house. Second, every doctor on Earth says the number-one remedy for an illness is rest. Why don't people follow doctors' orders, stay home, rest and get better?

I can understand to a degree when someone goes to work when they are not well. They may have pressing work schedules they must follow, staff to supervise, limited sick time, etc. But going to Bingo is certainly not a necessity or a requirement. And a Bingo hall is a closed, confined space where every cough and sneeze is going to release germs that circulate

and circulate through the room and potentially infect every person there. Why would an ill person want to do that? Are they also mentally ill?

Another part of this is that when you are sick, your brain is foggy and you do not think as clearly as when you are well. It is certainly unsafe for a person with a cloudy brain (from illness or medication) to be behind the wheel of a vehicle driving to Bingo. The same is true for when you are at Bingo trying to concentrate on all those numbers and patterns to win the games. Chances are you will not be able to focus and will miss numbers and lose. Why waste your money and time? Go home and stay home!

Nobody likes being sick. And maybe it is just human nature to be stubborn about an illness and decide that it is not going to keep YOU down and you head out to places and activities to prove that you are stronger than the virus that is messing up your system.

Meanwhile, you are making yourself miserable as well as those around you miserable as you sneeze and cough your way through your day and spread your germs to others.

Go home. Stay home. Get better. We'll save you a seat at Bingo for when you are well again.

#### Hi Health Nut.

A few factoids to help support your case:

- A cough or sneeze can spread germs up to 200 feet;
- A sneeze can contain 200 million virus particles;
- Germs can stay alive in the air for up to 45 minutes or more;
- Sick people are snotty and gross (OK, that's more of a personal opinion).

As a bit of a germaphobe, I can appreciate the message your email is passing along: Catch a cold or flu? Go home, stay home, take care of yourself and get better.

Obviously, even when you're sick, there are going to be responsibilities you are unable to avoid: job, school, appointments, family responsibilities and so on. But the vast majority of others—movies, dining out, shopping, Bingo, etc.—can easily be back burnered so that 1, you get better sooner and 2, you aren't spreading your germs to the general population.

I've actually wondered—when I've been at some outing like Bingo and there is a person there who is clearly under the weather and sneezing and coughing up a storm—if it is appropriate for someone in charge to politely approach the sick person and ask them to leave?

This certainly sounds like an issue beyond anything Bingo hall management can deal with.

Which brings us back to our original premise of common courtesy, and the hope that people under the weather stay home and keep their germs to themselves.

# More Protections for Home Loans

One of our veterans benefits is help with buying a home. The Department of Veterans Affairs has a new policy that protects veterans from predatory lenders when we refinance loans.

The lending industry has some bad actors who pull scams on home buyers, adding extra interest, fees and multiple expenses, and more. The new policy calls a halt to all that, adding to the list of protections we already have when buying a home with a VA guaranteed loan.

For example, lenders must provide us with a comparison of what we already have and what we propose to get in a refinance. This needs to include, among other things, a comparison of the monthly payments so we can see what we actually will save.

If you have a fixed rate and are refinancing for another fixed rate, that rate must be at least 0.50 less. If you have a fixed rate and are refinancing for an adjustable rate, that rate must be at least 2.00 less.

To read the rest of the changes, go online to www.benefits.va.gov.

Modifications to homes for disabled veterans are available for certain service-connected disabilities. The VA will help by giving up to \$81,000 for those modifications under Specially Adapted Housing (SAH) grants. To learn more, go online to www. va.gov and search for "adapted housing grants." Another type of grant, Special Housing Adaptation (SHA) grant, can help in other ways, with a \$16,217 cap. If a veteran needs a ramp or widened doorways, these grants can help.

But a heads up — SAH grants are limited to 30 veterans a year, and all the money is gone for fiscal 2018. For next year, check eligibility requirements and apply early.



Bingo operations need to realize that something like parking, which they may not give much thought to, could actually be discouraging people from going to their games and mean less money for them. — **JG**, via email


#### Dear JG:

# Simplified Tablets Designed for TechChallenged Seniors

#### Dear Savvy Senior,

I'm interested in getting my 78-year-old mother a tablet for video calls and email but want to get one that's super simple to use. What can you recommend? — **Shopping Around** 

#### Dear Shopping,

There are several different ways you can go about getting your mom a simplified tablet that's easy for her to use. Depending on how much help she needs and how much you're willing to spend, here are some different options to consider.

#### Simplify a Tablet

If you or your mom already has a tablet, but it's too difficult for her to use, you can install a free senior-friendly software application on it like Oscar Senior, which works on Apple iPads and Android tablets.

This app will change the appearance and performance of your tablet into a simplified device with big understandable icons to only commonly used features (video calls, photos, instant messages, Internet, news, weather, reminders, contacts, etc.) for easy navigation, with no clutter. It even offers remote access capabilities so you can gain access to your mom's tablet from your smartphone, so you can see what she sees, and help her if she gets stuck.

#### **Limited Tech Skills**

If you're interested in purchasing your mom a new tablet that's specifically designed for seniors, you have options here too, depending on how simple it needs to be.

For seniors with some, but limited computer/tablet skills, there's AARP's RealPad, which is an Android Intel tablet with a 7.85-inch touchscreen that provides a simplified home page with large text icons to frequently used functions. It also comes with 24/7 phone support, and a "Real QuickFix" tool that connects users to technology support agents over the Internet who can access the tablet and fix problems. Available at AARPrealpad. org for only \$60, AARP recently announced that the RealPad will be discontinued when inventory sells out in a few months, but they will continue offering customer/ technical support throughout the life of the product.

#### No Tech Skills

If your mother is completely unfamiliar with technology, two simpler options are the grandPad and Claris Companion.

GrandPad is a 7-inch touchscreen Android tablet that is designed for seniors, ages 75 and older. It comes with a stylus, charging stand and Verizon 4G LTE built-in so it works anywhere within the Verizon network - home Wi-Fi is not necessary.

This tablet provides a simplified menu of big colorful icons and large text, to only essential features, giving your mom clutterfree, one-touch access to make phone calls and video calls, send voice emails, view photos and videos, listen to personalized music, check the weather, play games and more. But, to simplify usage and avoid confusion, it does not offer Web browsing.

GrandPad also has a "Help" button that offers 24/7 phone/ tablet remote assistance to help your mom with any facet of her tablet, and it provides damage and theft insurance so if your mom breaks or loses her tablet it will be replaced at no additional cost. Available at grandPad.net or call 800-704-9412, a grandPad leases for \$60 per month, or \$53/month if you pay one year in advance.

Another good option to check out is the Claris Companion, which offers Wi-Fi and 4G tablets that costs \$549 and \$649 respectively, plus a \$29 and \$49 monthly subscription fee.

These tablets are designed specifically for elderly seniors living at home so their family can

connect with them socially via video calls, email, text messages and photos. It also gives caregivers the ability to receive alerts and monitor compliance with medications, treatments, and important appointments.

Claris Companions are 10-inch Android tablets that have big buttons and text to only essential functions. They come in a thick bamboo frame, with a charging stand that prop them up, and can be customized to fit your mom's needs and abilities. Claris also offers a lower cost tablet option for \$349 and an Android app for \$29.

## **Poker Talk**



# **Bluffs and** Semi-bluffs

By Jonathan Little

Too often, amateur poker players only bet when they have a strong hand. They assume that the way to win in poker is to wait for a premium hand and then pile their money into the pot, hoping some oblivious chap pays them off.

In reality, if you only put a significant amount of chips into the pot when you're holding premium hands, your opponents will rarely pay you off if they're even remotely competent.

Suppose your opponent, sitting on a stack of 100 big blinds, raises to three big blinds from middle position, and only you call from the button. For the fun of it, let's say that you make a blind call without examining your cards.

The flop comes 8h 7h 4d. Your opponent makes a bet of four big blinds, which is a little more than half the size of the pot.

Some players would only raise in this spot with 6-5, 8-8, 7-7, 4-4 or 8-7. While it's a natural instinct to want to raise with these premium hands, your opponent can easily fold her entire range, meaning that it's going to be very hard for you to get value from a raise.

One way to avoid running into this problem is to bluff from time to time. The hands that are best to bluff with are those that also have some chance to improve to the best hand. In this case, the best bluffs are flush draws and straight draws. If your goal is to be balanced (as it often should be), you can actually raise with about two times as many semi-bluffs as value hands, because many of your semi-bluffs will improve to premium hands on the turn.

So, in this situation, in addition to raising with your premium made hands, you should raise with many of your draws, such as flush draws or 10-9 for an openended straight draw. If you have a tight image, you can coax your opponent into playing poorly by folding too often, because she will incorrectly assume that you are only raising with premium hands. If your opponent is a calling station, that's fine too, because your premium hands will get paid off, and there will be a decent percentage of times when your draws are completed by the river.

If you bet the flop and your opponent calls, it is usually wise to continue betting on the turn with most of your range. This will make you difficult to play against, because your opponent will have no idea whether you have a premium hand or a semi-bluff. The same holds true for the river.

It's important that you develop a strategy to help you establish with your opponents that any action you take is not obviously strong or weak. If your opponents know that your flop bets are always strong, you make their decisions easy. You win when your opponents make mistakes, so develop a strategy that will lead them to make as many mistakes as possible.

# **Blackjack Misinformation**

It amazes me how many blackjack players believe the misinformation dispensed by fellow players, and even dealers, about the game of blackjack. Here is a reminder of just a few of these nuggets of misinformation.

#### "Picture Cards Always Follow Picture Cards."

Some players will refuse to hit their stiff hands if they just saw a picture card come out of the shoe. The reason: they believe that "a picture card always follows a picture card." Clearly that can't be the case and, in fact, the opposite is true, namely that once you see a picture card the chance that the next card will be a picture card has decreased. The reason? If you just saw a picture card there must be less of them in the un-played deck

of cards, meaning your chances of drawing another has decreased (not increased).

#### "Always Figure the Dealer Has a 10 in the Hole."

Really? In a standard deck of 52 cards there are 16 ten-valued cards (the four tens, jacks, queens, and kings). That leaves 36 non-ten valued cards left in a deck. So roughly only 31% of the cards in a deck are "tens" and 69% are non-tens. Basically, there are roughly twice as many non-tens as tens, so it is more likely that the dealer will have a non-ten in the hole rather than a ten. Got it?

#### "That Third Baseman is Killing Me."

Many players believe the play of the third base player can "bring down" the entire table. Some honestly believe that the third base player should "sacrifice has hand" for the good of his fellow players. The reality is this: it really doesn't matter how your fellow players, including the third baseman, play their hands; no question the outcome of the round could be different if the third baseman takes a card when he shouldn't, but his lack of skills could just as well result in everyone winning their hand as losing their hands. In the long run it's a wash, and your chance of winning and losing aren't going to change. You may not like to hear this, but you could play with six chimpanzees and your chance of ultimately winning and losing will not be affected.

#### "Always Insure the Good Hands."

Most players will insure a 10-10 but never a 5-3. Guess what? Insuring the 20 is a worse play than insuring an 8. Why? Because when you make the insurance bet you are betting that the dealer has a ten in the hole (for a blackjack). The fact that you are holding two ten-value cards (with your 20) means the chance that the dealer's hole card is a ten is less than if you held a 5-3. Insurance is a bad bet, but it's an even worse bet when you hold a "good hand."

#### "Don't Mess with the Order of the Cards."

Many players cringe when a new player enters a game in midshoe. Why? Because the order of the cards that will be dealt to players changes and they believe that this works against the players. This of course is nonsense. You don't know what the order of the cards is in the shoe and if a new player changes the order, it could help you as much as hurt you. The order of the cards is not sacred!

#### "Press your Luck."

Many players who win two or three hands in a row will start pressing (or increasing) their bets to take advantage of their luck. I hate to be the bearer of bad news, but just because you won the previous two or three hands, this has no bearing on your chances of winning the next hand. The odds of winning any hand at blackjack is roughly 42% regardless of how many hands that you just won. So

"pressing your luck" might be a fun thing to do, but it isn't going to win you more money in the long run (in fact, by betting more money you expose more of your bankroll to the house edge).



# **Eat Your** Veggies!

Dear Annie,

Can you suggest some recipes for vegetables that might encourage my children to eat more vegetables. — Viola from Greenville, South Carolina

#### Dear Viola,

I have several suggestions. Good luck with the kids. — Annie

#### FRENCH FRIED CAULIFLOWER

1 box frozen cauliflower 2 eggs, beaten 1 cup breadcrumbs ½ inch vegetable or canola oil

Parboil the cauliflower until barely tender. Drain well. Dip in beaten eggs and breadcrumbs. Pour oil into a ½-inch depth

heavy skillet (I use a cast iron and it gives a great crunch). Fry cauliflower 3 to 5 minutes or until golden brown; drain on paper towels. Serves 4.

#### **GRILLED CARROTS**

12 carrots, whole, peeled and washed 3 tablespoons olive oil Kosher salt Black pepper ½ teaspoon rosemary ½ teaspoon thyme

Heat grill to medium-high heat. While grill is heating up, trim the tops and any fibrous ends of the carrots. Wash and peel the carrots patting with a paper towel to dry. You can cut carrots in half lengthwise if thick enough to still be at least ½ to 3/4-inch thick. Place a single layer of carrots in a baking dish and coat lightly with olive oil. Sprinkle the oiled carrots with the desired amount of salt and pepper, then season with thyme and rosemary. Once the grill is heated, place carrots on the grill (cut side down if cut in half lengthwise) and cook for about 10-12 minutes with lid down, turning once during cooking. You will know when carrots are done when both sides are seared and can be pierced with a fork.
