n a few weeks we will be celebrating Thanksgiving. A time with family and friends for many of us, it can also be a time of sadness and loneliness for others.

- Please pray for our children and teachers.



ave you ever wondered what it would be like to show hospitality to strangers from a completely different culture and language? Students and staff at Trinity Christian School (TCS) are excited to have this opportunity. We have welcomed seven students and their coordinator from Keystone Leadership Academy in South Korea. The students will be attending school at TCS until the end of February, learning about the United States and increasing their English-speaking and writing skills. The students are staying with school families, and the coordinator is living with Trinity church member, Margy Becker.

Another way our students are learning to put their faith in action and reach out to others is by participating in **Operation Christmas Child.** We began sending shoe boxes to children around the world in desperate circumstances in 2003 and have sent 2,295 boxes. For the past several years, we have joined together with Trinity Church in this amazing ministry.



You are invited to come to chapel on November 17th at 11:15 a.m. as we pray over the boxes and load them into the church van to be taken to the collection center here in San Diego. Kindergarten will be leading Chapel that day so it's sure to be a wonderful morning, seeing how God is working in the lives of the children who come to the Trinity hill five days a week to be challenged in their learning with academic excellence and to put their faith in action.

Plans are underway for the annual Fall Festival, a joint venture between the church and the school. The outdoor carnival will feature game booths for children, a dunking booth, and an opportunity drawing for an iPad Mini and Disneyland tickets. We pray this outreach event will draw our neighbors and friends in the community to experience the love and grace of Jesus exemplified in the Body of Christ here on the Hill.

The month of November will also bring an opportunity for the teachers and principals to attend the Association of Christian Schools International Convention in Anaheim. This conference is always encouraging as we grow professionally and deepen our understanding of our mission as a Christian school. The school will be closed the week of Thanksgiving for the teachers to attend ACSI on Monday and Tuesday and have a time of refreshment spending time with family the rest of the week.

Olivia Wallace will be leaving the middle of this month to live with an unreached people in Africa, teaching English and developing relationships. Please pray for her that she will easily assimilate into the culture, that she will have wisdom and courage, and that God will keep her safe and well.

2018 Missions Trip

On November 5th, after the one service, there will be a meeting in Ward Center regarding the 2018 missions trip, two weeks in a refugee camp on Lesvos Island in Greece. We will be partnering with GEM - Greater European Missions. Our own Harvey and Betty Smith were missionaries through this organization for many years. We need six people to commit to this adventure in order to go. Please prayerfully consider going on this mission journey.

At the meeting, we will be discussing time lines, duties, etc. I would covet your prayers for this meeting and for those who are considering going.

If we are able to go, we would be volunteering in a refugee camp where 3,500 people wait for news on whether they will be awarded asylum somewhere in the European Union. The refugees come from different countries – primarily Syria and Afghanistan, and a number of North African countries – all of them Muslims. Because of the desperate situation they are in, many are very open to the Gospel.


