Update on Changes for Next School Year

We are very pleased to announced, that based on the number of students returning next year, we will be separating our 5th and 6th Grade classrooms. With this change comes some moving around of our current teachers, as well as the hiring of a new teacher. For the 2018-2019 School Year, Mr. Hesseling will be the primary 6th Grade teacher as well as teaching science to the 4th and 5th Grade. Mrs. Fritz will be the primary 5th Grade teacher as well as teaching Language Arts to the 4th and 6th Grade. Finally, we are very pleased to announce that Mrs. Bloomfield will be returning to the 4th Grade as their primary teacher, after spending the last 5 years in 2nd Grade. Mrs. Bloomfield will also teach Math to the 5th and 6th Grade.
