Then followed a series of films that made much of Tim's military experiences, including The Base (1999), where he starred opposite Mark Dacascos in a performance that had him compared to a young Willem Dafoe, and The Substitute: Failure Is Not an Option (2001) which also starred Treat Williams and Bill Nunn.
