notes on the Music Man

- ★ The Music Man is set in 1912, the year the Titanic sank and the year Arizona and New Mexico were admitted to the Union. July 4th, the day our show begins was the first day the 48-star American flag was flown.
- ★ The first musical number, Rock Island, is so named because presumably, the salesmen are leaving Rock Island, Illinois, and crossing the Mississippi into Iowa.
- ★ The town of River City is based on Meredith Wilson's hometown, Mason City, Iowa.
- ★ The famous bandmasters Gilmore, Liberatti, Conway, Creatore, Handy, and Sousa could not have have all "come to town on the very same historic day" as they were not all living at the same time.
- ★ "Aught-five" comes from "a naught" meaning zero.
- ★ "On the que veev" is a mispronouncement of the French "qui vive" or "Whose side are you on?"
- ★ O'Clarke, O'Mendez, and O'Klein are 3 famous Cornet players with O' added to their names to make them sound Irish.
- ★ The Epworth League was a Methodist association for young ladies aged 18-35. This lets us know that the Shinns are Methodists, but we presume that Zaneeta isn't old enough to be a member.
- ★ The Wells Fargo Wagon was the Amazon of its day.
- ★ Shipoopi is a word Meredith Wilson made up.
- ★ "The coward dies a thousand deaths, a brave man only 500" is a misquote of Shakespeare's Julius Ceasar. The correct quote is "Cowards die many times before their deaths, the valiant never taste of death but once."
- ★ Women's suffrage was in high swing in 1912, just as women's fashions continued to restrict women's movement with tight corseting, hobble skirts, and enormous decorated hairstyles and hats.
