<u>Safety</u>

Have you ever used a piece of scrap wood to mount your turning blank?

Your blank is secured really well to the scrap, you start turning, and then all of a sudden your piece goes flying through the air. Why did the turning blank come unsecured from the scrap wood may be your first thought. Well, you may find that your blank is still attached to the scrap piece, and what happened was the scrap piece had come apart.

Lesson learned, always take the time to take a good look at that piece of scrap prior to using it. Scrap with a crack, or weak spot can lead to unsuccessful results with possible injuries.

Show and Tell

The Challenge for February was to turn a hollow form, and we had four members take on that challenge. For March, the challenge was to turn a tool handle, and we had four members take on that challenge. We also had seven members who shared their other projects with us. Yard Sale

The Club is going to have a yard sale on Friday, April 18, and Saturday, April 19. This is a fundraiser event for the club, and a chance for you to sell some items.
