



Award Programs

Rainbow Skills Award

The Rainbow Award is a progressive outdoor skills training program for campers. Each year the girls earn a patch or segment to go around the patch to show their progress through the program. At the Camp Aide level, the girls are proficient enough to teach the program to younger campers. This set of patches may be worn on the back of the Girl Scout vest or sash and may be transferred from one Girl Scout level to another.

The color sections are earned sequentially. If a girl enters camp and has not had the chance to earn previous sections of the award, the Camp Aide for that unit will work with her to ensure that she is "caught up" on her award work.

Color Sections:

- 1st Grade Daisies – Center Patch
- 2nd Grade Brownies – Red
- 3rd Grade Brownies – Yellow
- 4th Grade Juniors – Orange
- 5th Grade Juniors – Green
- 6th Grade Cadettes – Purple
- 7th Grade PAIT – Silver Outer Ring
- 8th Grade Camp Aide – Gold Outer ring



Badges

Our campers will be involved in a variety of activities that contribute to their earning certain Girl Scout Badges. While we are not a badge camp, we want to ensure that every girl is able to get credit for her work towards these meaningful awards. Parents of scouts are encouraged to print out the list of badge links and submit the list for their daughter's age group to their unit leader. In the event that campers complete an entire badge – the badge can be purchased directly or online from the Girl Scout store.

Cadette Leader-In-Action Award

Our 6th grade Cadette units will work together to complete the first two activities required to earn the LiA associated with the Journey “It’s My Story – Tell It” & Media LiA. They will also be introduced to components of the PAIT training to support their LiA activities.



Cadette Program Aide-In-Training

The Program Aide-In-Training (PAIT) units (7th grade) will complete the last two activities associated with the LiA award along with Core PA training and Outdoor Specialization training. By the end of camp PAITs will have completed all the pre-requisites necessary to apply for a first year Camp Aide position at Camp Wil-Lo-Linn or any Girl Scout Camp (if they have fulfilled all previous requirements).

Program AIDE AWARD

First year Camp Aides will be considered PA award candidates. Their work with campers their first summer will complete the final requirements for mentoring younger campers and they will be awarded the Program Aide Pin.



Counselor-In-Training Awards

Camp Aides who have a minimum of two years experience at Camp Wil-Lo-Linn are eligible to earn the Day Camp Counselor-in-Training pin. This involves taking on leadership roles in assisting adults and mentoring younger Camp Aides either in units or activity stations. There are two levels Counselors can achieve. Girls must earn the level one before the specialized level two is achievable.
