

Resident Spotlight



was born December 10. 1956 to Delmar and Jacqueline Smith. I grew up in Marceline, Mo where I graduated in May of 1975. My dad, the whiskey man and I went into the sawmill business together upon graduation. I didn't feel like I was making enough so I went to work at the Rock Quarry. Life was going pretty well for me at that time. My high school sweet heart, Tammy Tarpening, graduated in May of 1976. We married in September of 1976. Tammy

and I welcomed our first daughter, Jessica, in February of 1977. A month after our first daughter arrived, an opportunity came along

for me to go to work on the Santa Fe Railroad. The next spring our daughter, Crystal, arrived. In April to be exact. I had always loved riding my Harley Davidson motorcycle and rode as often as possible. Unfortunately, I had a motorcycle accident in July of 1979, which resulted in my left leg being amputated below the knee. I was fitted with a prosthetic leg and was able to get around just fine. I returned to work on the railroad. We lived on Tammy's family farm after getting married. We stayed there until April of 1982 when we purchased our own home in town. Things were really great for a while. Our daughters were thriving and work was going great as I was the fore-

man of the tie gang. I was involved in a diving accident on June 16, 1984 that changed my life forever. I broke my neck, resulting in me becoming a quadriplegic. I was paralyzed from the chest down. I went to physical and occupational therapy and was able to move

my arms and figured out how to feed myself, brush my teeth, dial a phone and use a remote. Things started to look up again and I kept my positive attitude. I volunteered at Walt Disney Elementary, where the first graders practiced their reading to me in the afternoons. After my girls graduated in May of 1996, I started training with Voc. Rehab to learn how to drive again. I bought a van and


had it fixed up so I could drive it. I got a job as a people greeter at the Brookfield Wal-Mart in 1998. I really enjoyed that job. I was a member of the Eagles, where I could meet with friends. I decided to run for councilman for the City of Marceline. I was a council member for 15 years and even ran for Mayor. I was elected to that position for a two year term. I was a board member of RAIL (Rural Advocates for Independent Living) for 10 years. I was also a member of the First

> Christian Church in Marceline where I

was the board president for 10 years. Despite being confined to a wheel chair, I was able to stay busy and be involved in my community. I became a grandpa for the first time in August of 1997. Alexus Marie will always hold a special place in my heart for giving me the title of Grandpa (Papa). My second granddaughter, Sierra Ann, came along in October of 2002. My first grandson, Logan Andrew, came along in August of 2003. My third and final granddaughter, Brooklyn Elise, arrived in July of 2006. I welcomed my first son-in-law, Eric

Sears, in October of 2011 and my second son-in-law, Mike Baker, in December of 2011. My second and final grandson, Hayden Thomas, arrived in May of 2012. I lost my beloved Tammy to cancer in September of 2012. I lost my RAIL hours and wasn't able to remain in my home. I was in a couple different nursing homes

around Marceline before moving to Loch Haven to be closer to my daughters.



Summertime Dips



Pico de Gallo

6 roma (plum) tomatoes, diced

1/2 red onion, minced

3 Tablespoons chopped fresh cilantro

1/2 jalapeno pepper, seeded & minced

1/2 lime, juiced

1 clove garlic, minced

1 pinch garlic powder

1 pinch ground cumin (or to taste)

Salt & ground black pepper to taste

Stir the tomatoes, onion, cilantro, jalapeno pepper, lime juice, garlic, garlic powder, cumin, salt and pepper together in a bowl. Refrigerate at least 3 hours before serving.

Now it's all ready to eat with tortilla chips or on tacos and quesadillas!



Guacamole

3 whole avocados Pico de Gallo (from recipe at left) Lime juice Salt to taste

Start with buttery-soft avocados. Half them, length wise, and remove the pits. Using a spoon, scrape the "meat" out into a bowl. Next, with the bottom of a clean cup (or fork), smash the avocados, leaving some chunky pieces. Add salt to taste. Next, add a generous helping of Pico de Gallo. Fold it together. Lastly, squeezes the juice of half a lime over the top and give one last stir. Tightly cover with saran wrap to prevent air from reaching it. It might last in the frig about 24 hours. Guacamole is usually something you want to eat the same day.
