A NOTE FROM PASTOR JIM

"Be still, then, and know that I am God (Psalm46:10)"

As I drove to the Parish today on the Taconic Parkway, I was continually impressed with the foliage as I went up and down the hills and around the curves. Everywhere I looked was golden and red. It was enhanced because the skies were slightly gray and there was a fine mist which had the effect of melting the colors together. All I could think was that I am so thankful to God for His artistry. It was the picture of beauty and peace.

Yet, at the same time, I am aware that this feeling of beauty and peace seems to be forgotten in our land these days. Every four years at this time we find ourselves close to national elections. There always seems to be a certain level of tension in the air at that time, but this year it is heightened. At the same time our nation has experienced acts of civil unrest, some of which was violent. Overshadowing all of this has been the pandemic. On the one hand, we are blessed that so far, things seem to be fairly under control in our Parish. Still, we live under restrictions. And yet, we are thankful to be able to be worshipping together. But there still are many of us who have health conditions that make coming together to worship a fearful notion. We miss them, but understand their concerns. We continue to video the service at Third and it is available on You Tube each week.

Be still, the, and know that I am God.

This verse is from Psalm 46, the Psalm which inspired Martin Luther to write his most famous hymn, "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God". As you know, Martin Luther himself lived through times that were not so peaceful. It still amazes me how a simple (but inspired and brilliant) pastor was able to start a movement which challenged the powerful hierarchy of the church in Rome. Although he was excommunicated, and a bounty was placed on his life, he would not recant his teachings. That was because he knew they were true. They were rooted in Scripture. They were rooted in the Word of God. I am sure that this verse from Psalm 46 gave him solace and confidence. He was able to remain at peace and continue to preach, write, and teach, knowing that God was his refuge and strength.

Let us try to do the same. Before we know it, our Church year will be over and Advent will be upon us. It should be a time for reflection and a time for preparation for the coming of the Lord. Let us be still, then, and know that the LORD is God. He truly is our refuge and strength in times of trouble.
