Grief Support Group: An opportunity to gather once a month to support one another in their grief journey.


Prayer Partners Ministry: A covenanted group praying together and individually.

New Tuesday Night Bible Study Beginning October 8

Join us for our new 6 week Bible study as we examine the most difficult teachings of Jesus using Dr. Amy Jill Levine's wonderful book, *The Difficult Words of Jesus.* We will meet from 6:30-8:00 P,M, <u>Tuesdays October 8, 15, 22, 29, November 11, 18.</u>

Jesus provided his disciples teachings for how to follow Torah, God's word; he told them parables to help them discern questions of ethics and of human nature; he offered them beatitudes for comfort and encouragement. But sometimes Jesus spoke words that followers then and now have found difficult. He instructs disciples to hate members of their own families, to act as if they were slaves, and to sell their belongings and give to the poor. He restricts his mission; he speaks of damnation; he calls Jews the devil's children. This is tough stuff!



DIFFICULT WORDS of JESUS

A BEGINNER'S GUIDE to HIS MOST PERPLEXING TEACHINGS

Together we'll explore these texts, letting Dr. Levine show us how these difficult teachings would have sounded to the people who first heard them, how have they been understood over time, and how we might interpret them in the context of the Gospel of love and reconciliation.

You will need to purchase a book which is available as an ebook or paperback through Amazon. Or you can let Pastor Santina know you need one and she will order it for you. The books are \$14 and financial assistance is available if needed.

We sure hope you will come and share your questions about and your frustrations with these texts - that is what makes a Bible study so interesting as we learn new appreciations of these mysterious texts together.



Fall Harvest Project for 'Charley's Pantry'

Last Christmas Hope UCC helped to launch a micro pantry at Rock Island Academy to help their school nurse, Heather McCarty, address the food insecurity needs of the students there. Your kind generosity in fulfilling the requests from our Advent Angel Tree provided food to help sustain families for the rest of that school year. It was a beautiful project that became something even more special: Heather met Charley Poor when she came to speak at church during Advent and again when he helped bring the many items that our congregation donated to the school. Heather also learned a lot about Charley through her friendship with his aunt, Becky Lapp, who teaches at the school. In honor of Charley's memory and in recognition of his church's support of this project, Heather and the school have named this micro pantry that provides needed groceries for families to get through a weekend and for students to find necessary clothing items "Charley's Pantry." It is absolutely an honor to know that Charley is remembered in such a kind and generous way with a program that is making a difference in the quality of life of so many children in our community.

We have an opportunity to continue to support this special program at Rock Island Academy by helping to restock Charley's Pantry for the upcoming Thanksgiving break. This is a week that the children will not have access to the daily breakfast or lunch program as the school is closed for the break. Nurse Heather works closely with the teachers to identify the students who are at risk regarding food insecurity to receive the groceries and the needs are growing.

Here is where Hope UCC can help. We will be collecting our Fall Harvest starting October 1st through November 17, on which day we will bless the 'harvest' before bringing it to the school. Please consider donating the following non-perishable ready to eat items for the harvest:

Smaller jars of peanut butter

Powdered milk packets or shelf stable milk

Fruit and vegetable cups

Individual small bags of chips

Individual serving size cups of Ravioli, soup, or similar

Cheese and cracker and or peanut butter cracker packs

Tuna 'Lunch To Go' kits

Canned fruit and vegetables with pull tab tops

If you would like to make a monetary donation to this Fall Harvest project, we will use that to purchase additional items as well as fresh fruit and bread closer to the delivery date. Please indicate "Fall Harvest" on the memo line of the check or on the envelope for a cash donation.

While you are gathering items for our friends at Rock Island Academy, please remember to pick up similar items for our Blessing Box in front of church. We continue to keep that stocked so that our neighbors in need have a place to find a few items they need to get through the day or week. It is highly utilized and greatly appreciated in our neighborhood!

It is easy to overlook the needs that are tucked away in our neighborhood where the needs are not as obvious. Food insecurity is a pervasive problem everywhere and we can make a difference in our community with our Blessing Box and with Charley's Pantry. Thank you for sharing in this Fall Harvest!

THIRD SUNDAY FAITH FORMATION FELLOWSHIP HOUR

This month we will begin a new intergenerational faith formation program – Third Sunday Faith Formation Fellowship Hour! WHAT IS IT?

This program is created to fully integrate our youngest friends with our oldest friends in faith formation as we celebrate and affirm families of one and families of many. The program on these Sundays will usually be focused on the theme from worship that day (or the series theme). A special aspect of this intergenerational program is that our younger friends can 'adopt' an older friend as their 'grandfriend' so they can accompany each other in the activity so that they are both fully integrated in the event and can get to know each other.

WHEN IS IT?

On that 3rd Sunday of each month, which happens to be the Sunday that our children and youth will be serving as greeters, ushers, and liturgists. This month we will gather on October 20th. HOW DOES IT WORK?

We will have tables designated for this program in Fellowship Hall during Fellowship Hour so anyone who wishes to engage in "Sunday school" can do so together. This monthly 45 minute program will begin at 11:30 which will give everyone an opportunity to engage in coffee fellowship prior to the start of the faith formation program.

DO I HAVE TO DO THIS DURING FELLOWSHIP HOUR?

Please do not worry, you do not have to be part of the program during Fellowship Hour – tables will be clearly marked for those folks who would like to engage in the program. However, we sure hope you give it a try and are part of this fun way to get to know each other and share our faith formation journey together!
