In this session we will discuss creating valid and targeted formative and summative Latin language assessments. Participants will learn how to incorporate several engaging apps in their daily routines as a means for taking a pulse on their students progress. Participants will also practice writing student learning objectives and corresponding summative assessments.

## New Teacher Roundtable - Chandler Dawson, Westmoore High School - English

This is a round table discussion for college students, as well as first and second year teacher. We will discuss ideas and strategies that prove useful as teachers new to the profession, and teaching World Languages.

Project-based Language Learning: Preparing Students for the 21st Century - Dr. Jie Zhang, University of Oklahoma - English/Chinese

This presentation discusses how to incorporate project-based language learning (PBLL) in Chinese classrooms to prepare students for the skills needed for the 21<sup>st</sup> century. It starts with a brief introduction of the gold standards of PBLL: a challenging problem or question, sustained inquiry, authenticity, student voice and choice, reflection, critique and revision, and public product. It then discusses how to design gold standard projects for students at different proficiency levels to develop 21<sup>st</sup> century skills and incorporate career pathways. A class project that intermediate Chinese students recently worked on will be used an example to illustrate how teachers can scaffolding language learning and assess language output in PBLL.

Developing Habits of Discussion - Liliane Vannoy, Tulsa Public Schools - English

This presentation will focus on Tulsa Public Schools dual language program teaching strategies to develop habit of discussion.

Attendees will actively participate in a variety of activities in a language lab setting, followed by demonstrations of what goes on "behind the scenes". Throughout the session, attendees will become aware of how the language lab supports standards-based, performance-based instruction and assessment.
