Format:

Cover page: Title centered Name, School, Date below Title, centered or right-justified.

Abstract (separate page) – a short summary of what the reader can expect to find. It is not an introduction. It is a summary.

Introduction - orients the reader to your topic, covers basic material hopefully connected to something the reader is already familiar with.

Body- follows directly from Introduction, not a separate page

Conclusion or "For Further Research" – Follows directly from body.
