# SEE THE PURPLE, KNOW WHAT IT MEANS

Every week during Domestic Violence Awareness month, we are publishing a narrative about a survivor of abuse and violence. Each narrative is based on interviews conducted with St Cecilia's and other faith communities. A St Joseph the Worker parishioner conducted the interviews and composed the narratives. #### NICOLE:

He was handsome and well-educated, with a promising future. Nicole was also well-educated, ready to jump-start her career, committed to the relationship.

Their marriage moved like a whirlwind: Five children in ten years, 20 moves during their 30 years together, always to more exotic places or grander houses. He was moving up, professionally, attracting donors, gaining power in his field. Nicole was also establishing herself in her career: for her, work became a refuge where she enjoyed friendships, as well as the praise and the freedom lacking at home.

Even with the distraction and motion of family life, from the start, there were signs of his need for power and control. The signs were there later, as well, and more pronounced: strangling her during an argument until she passed out; beating the children for perceived disobedience; intentionally breaking dishes; pounding on walls with his fist. Later, the violence and cruelty was emotional: degrading comments, hours and days of silence, withdrawal of affection. Ultimately, he had absolute control over every aspect of their lives, including the money.

Although outsiders saw him as urbane, polished, charming, he was a frightening figure to his family. The pervasive atmosphere at home was one of fear, and Nicole felt unable to defend herself or her children from him.

Eventually, when the children were grown, Nicole made an escape plan, packed a plastic trash bag, and walked out the front door. She never saw or spoke to her husband again. Now, 16 years later, she and her children still deal with the aftermath of years of abuse, but the freedom from fear feels like a gift every day.
