FIRE DEPARTMENT:

Fire Chief Curtis Golden reported monthly runs so far have been 16 fire and 40 EMS for a total of 73 runs YTD. Mutual aid was provided to Amanda, Berne, Greenfield, and Lancaster. Non-burn months are in effect between 6:00am and 6:00pm. No burning is permitted.

OLD BUSINESS

- 1. Scott Brown property issue have been turned over to the Fairfield County Prosecutor's office.
- 2. Northview Court issues has been turned over to the Fairfield County Prosecutor's office.
- 3. There is state funding available for the demolition of vacant buildings on properties within the township. The board of trustees submitted for three properties and have been awarded state funding for two. The other property will go through the land bank. Michale Kaper will be coordinating this venture.
- 4. The trustees and fiscal officer attended the winter conference. There were good sessions and learned some new things.
- 5. The trustees found another plow for the truck from the Dexter Company. This will work to replace the broken cracked plow. Trustee Hurley motioned to purchase the new plow from Dexter for \$10,300. Trustee Wolfe seconded the motion. Roll call vote Ellinger Yes, Hurley Yes, Wolfe Yes. Motion approved.

NEW BUSINESS:

- 1. The trustees will be looking at ways if possible to regulate solar farms.
- 2. The trustees are looking into applying for grant money for playground bedding to replace the mulch. This would be a 75% grant and 25% match. Discussion followed with several suggestions concerning the safety of the playground and the deterioration of the mulch each year. The recommended material for the playground would be ADA assessible for wheelchairs and strollers.
