School is back in session and fall will soon be upon us. **The annual RRNA & RRCOP Annual Meeting and National Night Out will be on the first Tuesday in October (October 2), and it will be here soon. Plan now on attending! Meet and greet at the RRRC Clubhouse will start at 6 pm with County and City officials, SAPD officers, SAFD fire fighters, Code officials, etc. dropping by as their schedules permit. The RRNA Annual Meeting will start around 7 pm. Food and refreshments will be provided. There will also be door prizes.** Join your neighbors as we get to know one another better and talk about community successes and concerns.

Plan now too to attend either the October or November San Antonio Police Department Citizens-On-Patrol training and then joining RRCOP. Classes are Saturday, October 13, 9 am-1 pm, and Monday, November 5, 6-10 pm. Only one session is required. Without new members this program cannot continue as we presently know it, i.e. someone

patrolling our neighborhoods an average of two hours each day.

I'm sure you have seen it by now, i.e. drivers not abiding by the rules because of lack of knowledge, or to somehow advantage themselves over other drivers or just not paying attention. Need to refresh your memory since having taken a driving test? You can view the Texas DPS Driver Handbook at:

I know, more than you wanted to know or wanted to spend your time reading. Here are some little known or practiced rules you should observe to protect everyone's safety, not the least of which are school children.

When entering the roadway from any alley, building or driveway you must stop short of the sidewalk and yield the right-of-way to vehicles and pedestrians.

When entering a through street from a T-intersection you must stop and yield the right-of-way to through vehicles.

Be on the lookout for pedestrians ... and give them the right-of-way whether they have it or not.

Near a school, slow down, watch for children and prepare to stop suddenly if necessary.

Observe school zone speed limits! Cell phone use is prohibited in school zones.

Where white stop lines are painted on the pavement at traffic signs or signals you are required to stop behind the line.

Where stop lines are not present, you must stop short of a crosswalk when required to stop by traffic signs, signals or pedestrians in the crosswalk.

You may not park, stop or stand an idling vehicle on a sidewalk or crosswalk, in front of a public or private driveway, within 15 feet of a fire hydrant, within 20 feet of a crosswalk at an intersection, or where an official sign prohibits parking or standing.

It is illegal for any driver to permit their car to stand idling unattended without turning off the engine, locking the ignition, removing the key from the ignition and setting the brake. The driver and all passengers, regardless of age, in a passenger vehicle are required to use safety belts.

Any child under 8 years old must be secured in a federally approved child care seat to include in pickups, SUVs and trucks.

Stopped by a law enforcement officer? Slow down, move to your right and park safely. Place the vehicle in park, set the emergency brake, turn the engine off and activate the emergency warning flashers. Remain in the vehicle, keep both hands in sight on the steering wheel, and wait for the officer's instructions. The officer may approach from either side of the vehicle. Don't reach for anything in the vehicle until asked for it and informing the officer where it is located.

Of course, there's lot more to safe and courteous driving. Review your driving habits with the goal of becoming better! We'll all be safer and less stressed because of it. Be Safe. Enjoy the coming fall weather.

Greetings! I will begin by updating the community on the results of the latest board meeting that we just had at the end of August.

I will start with the news that **Damon Tabor**, who has been the HOA president for almost two years, is moving to another community away from Royal Ridge and has resigned as president. The board voted that I, **Lisa Gerlich**, will be acting president and that a new member, **Rebecca Waugh**, will be the interim vice-president until the next general PH1 homeowners meeting. All of us will miss Damon and are very grateful for the work that he has done.

The next item is maintenance updates. The fascia repairs are continuing. The crew has finished most of the work on the fascia of the garages. The contractors will restore the paint color any garages that were painted a different color to the original color. The repair work is continuing on the fascia of individual townhomes. No paint colors will change at this time. We should be able to start soliciting bids to repaint all the units sometime in the spring.

Because of the cost, it will be a 3- to 4-year process to get all the townhomes painted. At that time, some units will have a color change so that the color palette will be limited to the three colors (plantation brown, terracotta and olive grove) agreed to by residents who attended the special PH1 neighborhood meeting held in May. The board approved the plan that the architectural committee created.

If your townhome is already one of these three colors, the color will not change. The only colors that will change are units that are not one of the three colors. The architectural committee will inform the owners of any color changes by letter before any repainting occurs. The maintenance director reported that many owners need to replace or repair garage roofs. Please have your garage roof checked. The garage roofs are problematic because they are flat and people tend to forget about them because they are detached. If the garage roof is leaking, the painting contractors may need to repair fascia which will add to the cost.

The board will be sending letters to homeowners the first weekend in November to remind people that HOA dues for 2018 need to be paid by the end of the year.

The board scheduled the next general PH1 HOA meeting for Wednesday, March 6 at 7 pm at the clubhouse. Please put the date on your calendar and plan to attend.

I want to thank personally all members of the current board as well as the former President **Damon Tabor**. We are making progress and I appreciate everyone's help. I know everyone on the board is serving because of a desire to keep PH1 homes a desirable place to live. Please consider helping. There is a lot to be done. I have been working on the board for almost two years. I have also recently retired. Over the last several months I have gotten to know many more of my neighbors. This neighborhood has many tremendous people.
