Ordinance O-2014-20

**AN ORDINANCE BY THE COUNCIL OF AMELIA VILLAGE, CLERMONT COUNTY, OHIO
FOR THE PURPOSE OF ESTABLISHING A SPECIAL FUND WITHIN THE VILLAGE
BUDGET AND APPROPRIATIONS ACCOUNTING SYSTEM, AND TO BE IDENTIFIED AS
THE "INDIGENT DRIVERS INTERLOCK AND ALCOHOL MONITORING FUND";
AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.**

WHEREAS, the present system of budgeting and appropriations for Amelia Village does not incorporate an "Indigent Drivers Interlock and Alcohol Monitoring Fund" for receiving and accumulating moneys from fees or fines paid pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 4511.191, and;

WHEREAS, the funds of the "Indigent Drivers Interlock and Alcohol Monitoring Fund" shall only be used pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 4511.191 to pay the cost of an immobilizing or disabling device used by an offender who is ordered to use the device and who is determined by the court not to have the means to pay for the person's use of the device;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council of Amelia Village, Clermont County, Ohio that:

SECTION I. The Fiscal Officer of Amelia Village is directed and authorized to create an "Indigent Drivers Interlock and Alcohol Monitoring Fund" among its special funds.

SECTION II. Village Council further directs that all moneys received pursuant to Ohio Revised Code 4511.191 be deposited into the Indigent Drivers Interlock and Alcohol Monitoring Fund and that the funds be used pursuant to Section 4511.191 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION III. This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and general welfare of Amelia Village and its inhabitants. The reason for the emergency is the immediate need to establish an Indigent Drivers Interlock and Alcohol Monitoring Fund in compliance with Ohio Revised Code Section 4511.191, so that monies may be deposited into said fund. Therefore, provided this emergency clause receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members of Council it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor, otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

MR. DICKERSON moved to suspend the rules requiring three readings on three separate dates.

MRS. GERBER seconded the motion.
