## **Steps for Safety**

#### From the NMLRA

DISCIPLINE- The safety of competitors, range personnel, and spectators requires continuous attention by all to the careful handling of firearms, and caution in moving about the range. Self-discipline is necessary on the part of all competitors, range personnel, and spectators. Where such self-discipline is lacking, it is the duty of the range personnel to enforce discipline, and the duty of competitors to assist in such enforcement.

EARLY SHOTS-Any shot fired before the command of "COMMENCE LOADING, YOU MAY FIRE WHEN READY" is a serious infraction of many safety rules. Any competitor violating this rule will be disqualified from competition for a period of time determined by the sponsoring organization.

LATE SHOTS-Any shot fired after the command of "Cease Firing" without the express permission of the Range Officer is a serious infraction of the safety rules. At the Range Officer's discretion any one, or combination, of the following will be enforced. (1) Verbal reprimand (2) Shot with the highest numerical value on the target will be counted as a miss. (3) Target disgualification. (4) Suspension of the competitor. The Range Officer will sign the target, state the penalty and reason, and send it to the scoring room.

LOADING EARLY-Any person guilty of beginning to load a firearm before the command of "COMMENCE LOADING, YOU MAY FIRE WHEN READY" will be disgualified from competition for a period of time determined by the sponsoring organization.

INTOXICATING BEVERAGES OR DRUGS- The use of or impairment from intoxicating beverages and/or drugs on the firing line shall be ample cause for disqualification.

SMOKING-No person shall be allowed to smoke on the firing line at any time.

SAFETY INSPECTION OF EQUIPMENT-Range officials, acting under the authority of the Chief Range Officer, shall have the right to examine a shooter's equipment for safety concerns. The responsibility shall be on the shooter to submit questionable equipment for official safety inspection and approval in sufficient time prior to the beginning of a match so that it will not inconvenience either the shooter or the official.

UNSAFE FIREARM-No firearm shall be used in any competition if ruled unsafe by the Range Officer.

CARRYING FIREARMS-Firearms will be carried between the loading benches and firing line with the muzzle above the shooters' head and pointed directly up. (Exception: pistol shooters and bench shooters need not keep the muzzle above the shooter's head.)

FIREARM PLACEMENT BETWEEN RELAYS-After the command "GROUND ALL FIREARMS AND MAKE THE LINE SAFE" is given, the firing line is considered SAFE. During this safe time competitors may be directed to go down range and post and retrieve targets and all firearms on the firing line will be positioned safely and not touched. Rifles must be placed with the butt plate on the ground with the barrel pointed up and leaned against the loading bench; pistols will be placed on the loading bench with the barrel pointed muzzle up

BLOWING DOWN THE BARREL-There will be NO blowing down the barrel of any firearm during NMLRA matches in any manner that requires placing the head in front of the muzzle. A flexible blow tube may be used at the shooter's option, provided that the shooter's head is not placed in front of the muzzle.

LOADING FLINTLOCK FIREARMS-All flintlock firearms must be loaded with the frizzen and hammer in the forward position.

SWABBING BETWEEN SHOTS-Swabbing between shots with a damp patch to eliminate the possibility of glowing embers igniting the next powder charge is strongly recommended.

FALSE MUZZLES-All false muzzles must be attached by a cord or similar device so that the firearm may not be placed in a normal firing position without first removing the false muzzle from the barrel.

WHEN TO LOAD-No firearm will be loaded, or caps snapped, until the command "Commence loading, you may fire when ready."

CAPPING/PRIMING. After the command "Commence loading, you may fire when ready" has been given, shooters may cap/prime only on the firing line or designated area with the muzzle pointed downrange.





## HISTORICAL PAGE

## Stories and Reprints from the Past

Here is a reprint of a story written by Ken Baka about the June 1978 Rendezvous at Billy Creek in the Big Horns.

When the dark clouds and luminous shocks of the Wyoming electric storm passed east over the Bighorn Mountains near Billy Creek and revealed a dull half-moon last Saturday night, the mountain men let the hills know that they too could dance in the sky.

A pandemonium of drum beats, Indian chants and wild sounding beastly shouts or peals of laughter reverberated into the deeper realms of the forest. To an outsider a half-mile away, the sounds made the night crawl with a savage grace.

A den of thieves it might have been. Or a tribe of Indians in a pow-wow. Beware if approaching the drums seemed to say.

But no need to fear. On the other side of the pine forest, in an open park of tipi lodges and lean—tos, was a campfire of reincarnated Sublettes, Bridgers, Beckworths and Sacajaweas. Modern day replicas of those legendary souls who plied the fur trade in the Rocky Mountains between 1825 and 1840 shared Platte Valley jugs of straight whiskey, smoked kinnikinnick, sold skins, played the mandolin and sang folk songs. Silhouetted by the fire or by colonial candle lanterns were face3s of men wearing buffalo robes and wolf skin caps and a women with war paint.

They were some of the estimated 300 mountain men attending the National Muzzle Loaders Rifle Association's rendezvous. They came from Illinois, Ohio, Arizona, and California and various other states, bringing themselves and their children for a family get-together minus watches, blue jeans, flashlights and other items of modern times. Instead they were buckskin and showed their fanforades of trinkets, fur hats, brightly colored Hudson Bay coats, muzzle loaders and knives.

The muzzle loaders convention was an authentic as a mountain mean rendezvous of 130 years ago as anyone might imagine. It was a costume ball of another era conducted as realistically as possible. Only the conversation and lack of pony races told the visitors that this was not a grand encampment of 1833.

The formal convention of the National Muzzle Loaders Rifle Association, headquartered in Friendship, Ind. is one of the largest rendezvous in the United States. The five-day fur trade fair followed another rendezvous held in Montana. Many of those who pitched their lodges on the grasses of BLM land in the Bighorns attended both rendezvous and claimed that eh kin-ship, good fellowship, open oar and playful hours made for a relaxing vacation from the real world down below.


Bill Jennings of the Buffalo was this year's rendezvous chief. He and his dog soldiers or patrolmen enforced restrictions to make the camp as primitive as possible. They held a potlatch (a ceremonial gift-giving feast first started by the northwest Indians) and muzzle loading shoots for the men, lodge pole races for the women and tomahawk throwing contests for the children.


The real mountain men of the 1830's were said to often be refugees from society, which had suffered them reproach for on reason or another, and fled to the trapping plains and mountains to become an entrepreneur without social laws. It was a life of absolute liberty.

Although today's mountain men and women go to great costs to outfit themselves true to old form, the feeling of freedom and of a closely knit civilization are reasons why Jennings and his kind relive the frontier west.

What's more, nobody really wants to be reminded of how old they are, said Jenning's wife Nancy as she served refreshments in tin cups to visiting pilgrims. With children and grown men shuffling about in moccasins and breechcloths, the unadulteration of the mountain man rendezvous is a pleasing thing to understand.

## 2015 Wyoming Trap and Skeet Shoot April 24-25, 2015 Worland Shooting Complex, Worland, WY

The 4<sup>th</sup> Annual Wyoming Trap and Skeet shoot is now in the history books. We had a good turnout of shooters from as far as Saratoga, WY to Billings, MT with points in between from Lander, Buffalo, Cody, Powell, Lovell and here in Worland.

Frank Elzay (LZ) is kind of the ramrod of this outfit as very few of us know what we are doing in trap or skeet shooting. We had a good turnout of shooters, 15, which was down a little bit from last year. Jeanie Dunn ran the registration table and kept tabs on everyone for scores and money. LZ had made a new board with cards for each match. This worked real well. Kathi Morrison helped get the coffee going on Saturday morning and provided the fixings for lunch on Saturday. Katie Schade showed up Saturday morning with 3 pies to test out on us and they were great. Mason Kelley and Lyle Bader pushed the buttons on the trap houses and scored the shooters. Willie Felton was around on Friday if we needed any help.

Weather was perfect on Friday; I think it was a high of about 75 degrees, light winds and we were looking for a little shade. Saturday we were expecting rain in the afternoon, however, the rain started in the morning it was rather chilly so we hung out in the club house drinking coffee and tasting Katie's pies, we had an early lunch, and then the clouds left and we had perfect shooting weather the rest of the afternoon. The perfect shooting weather did not improve my shooting ability. We had a first time shooter, Katie's boy friend Zach Vaporis from Laramie. He doesn't need to worry about bringing home the bacon, Katie can out shoot him. Just kidding Katie and Zach. Friday night a few of us gathered at Butch's Place for supper and then Saturday night we gathered at the new destination eatery in Worland called Firenze. Metals were handed out to the 1<sup>st</sup> through 3<sup>Rd</sup> place shooters in each match. It worries me that we didn't have any junior shooters and only 2 women. We need to do something to try and get the youth involved. The Worland shooting complex now has remote control on the skeet shoot, this was a big improvement. I understand that they are also putting in a new 5 stand this summer at a cost of around \$40,000 so next year we will be able to shoot the 5 stand along with Trap and Skeet.


