These are guidelines for using ISIP data. Use your professional judgement and other data sources to place your students in groups that best meet their needs. For step 2, follow the sort on the left or right to begin with. For example: If a student is strategic (yellow) with their overall reading score and has a score of Lexile of 740, you would place the student on the right side of the chart. Then, if the student has a 1800 on SPL, you would still place them in Group C due to the high Lexile. However, you could check TF and other assessments to ensure correct placement is group C and not group B. The goal is to analyze the subtests, place students in groups based on needs. Then, plan, teach, assess, and adjust instruction based on data. This should be an ongoing cycle to ensure flexible grouping, which has a .49 effect size.
