

***Request for Materials and Services Quotations
Pursuant to Texas Water Development Board Project No. 73797 CID 02
for the Brookshire Municipal Water District
Hurricane Harvey Disaster Relief for
Failing Clay Pipe Replacement***

The Brookshire Municipal Water District (BMWD) has been awarded funding from the Texas Water Development Board for the 2018 Clean Water State Revolving Fund Hurricane Harvey Disaster Relief program to replace failing clay pipe pursuant to Texas Water Development Board (TWDB) Project Number 73797 CID 01. Texas Pride Utilities LLC is the apparent low bidder and is seeking to subcontract with qualified companies to provide:

1. FM 1489 – Installation of 2,131 lineal feet of 12-inch diameter sanitary sewer by pipe bursting with manholes and service reconnections; and
2. 6th Street Alley – Installation of 850 lineal feet of 6-inch diameter sanitary sewer by pipe bursting with service reconnects.
Additional Bid Item – Installation of 193 lineal feet of 6-inch diameter sanitary sewer by pipe bursting with service reconnects.
Additional Bid Item – Replacement of 2 manholes including base, asphalt replacement, and service reconnects, including pump arounds, complete in place.
Additional Bid Item – Proposed installation of manhole including base, asphalt replacement, and service reconnects, including pump arounds, complete in place.
Additional Bid Item – Remove and replace concrete at Gresham and Sixth Street Alley on private driveway.

Any contract or contracts awarded under this Request for Materials and Services Quotations are expected to be funded in part by a loan from the Texas Water Development Board, and shall be referred to as Project 73797 CID 02. Neither the State of Texas nor any of its departments, agencies or employees is or will be a party to this Invitation for Bids or any resulting contract.

Proposals must be received by Texas Pride Utilities no later than 3:00 P.M. on November 5, 2018. Texas Pride Utilities reserves the right to negotiate with any and all firms that submit proposals as per the Texas Water Development Board's Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program.

Any loan award is contingent upon release of funds from the Texas Water Development Board (TWDB).

This contract is subject to the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) "fair share policy", which includes EPA-approved "fair share goals" for Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) and Women Business Enterprise (WBE) firms in the Construction, Supplies, Equipment, and Services procurement categories. EPA's policy requires that applicants and prime contractors make a good faith effort to award a fair share of contracts, subcontracts, and procurements to Minority Business Enterprise and Women-Owned Business Enterprise firms. Although EPA's policy does not mandate that the fair share goals be achieved, it does require applicants and prime contractors to demonstrate use of the six affirmative steps.
